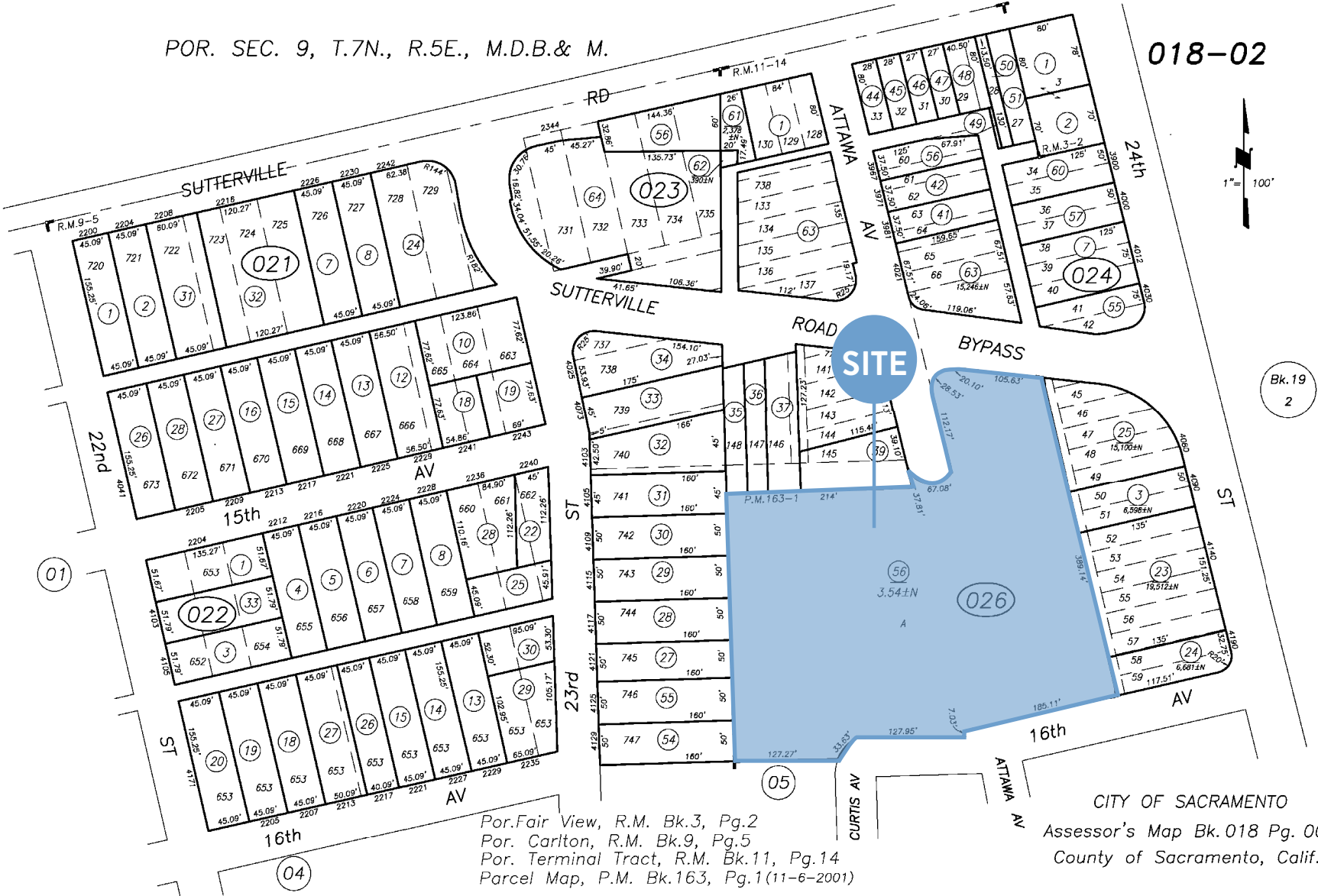

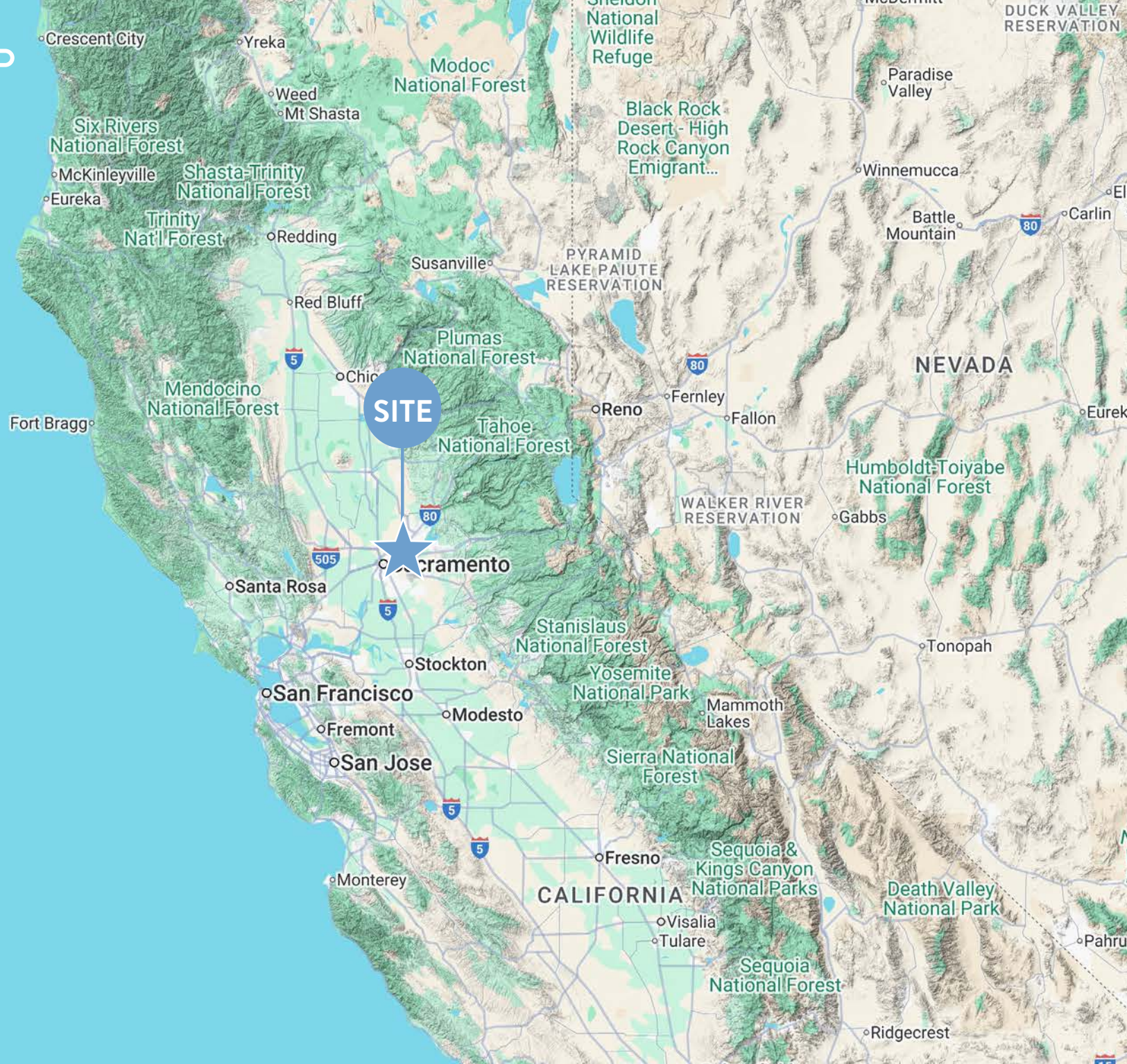

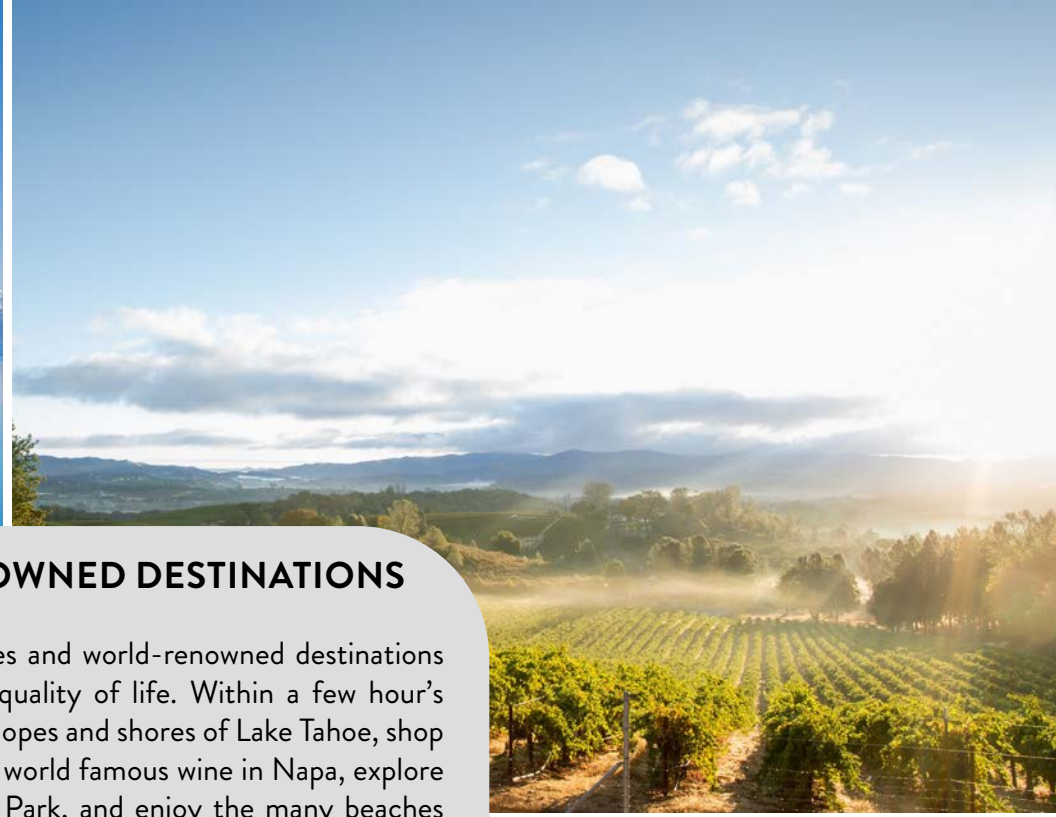


REGIONAL OVERVIEW

Sacramento is located at the confluence of the Sacramento River and the American River approximately 80 miles northeast of the San Francisco Bay Area. The City is surrounded by some of the most productive agricultural land in the world, framed by the Coast Mountains to the west and the Sierra Nevada Mountains to the east. Sacramento continues to gain recognition as one of the top performing apartment markets in the nation. As the state capitol of California, the fifth largest economy in the world, the Greater Sacramento Region is the sixth largest city in California and 28th largest MSA in the United States with a total population of over 2.5 million. 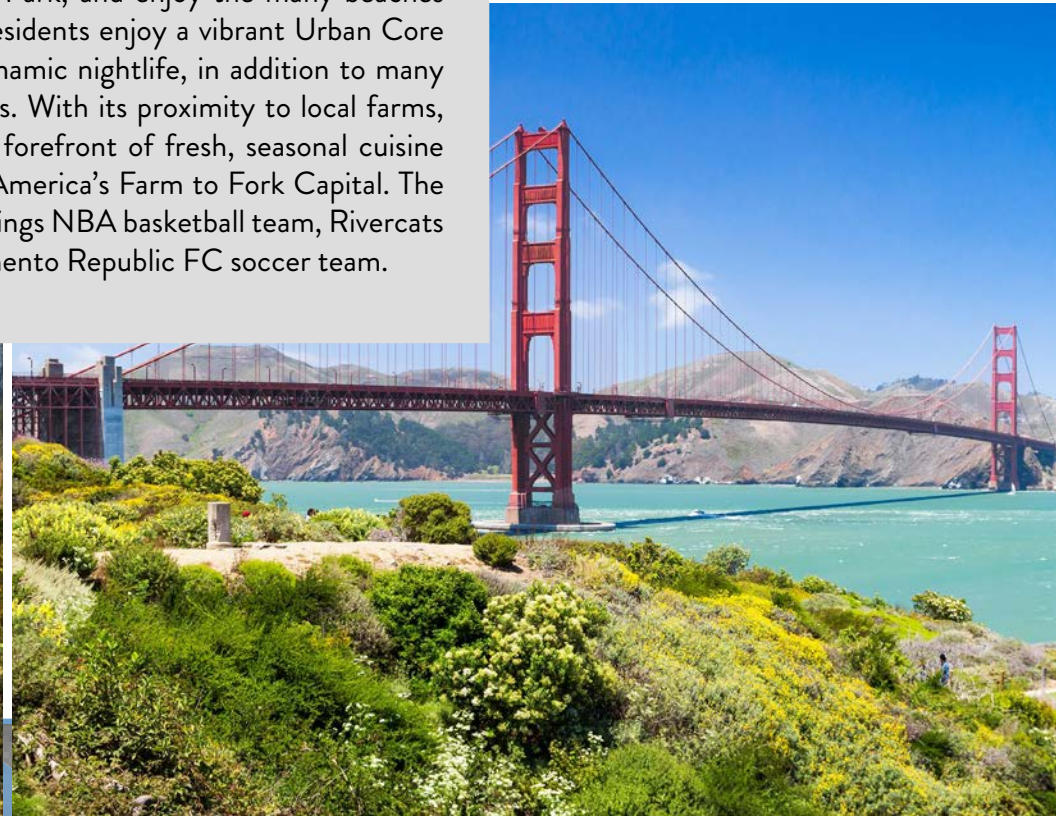
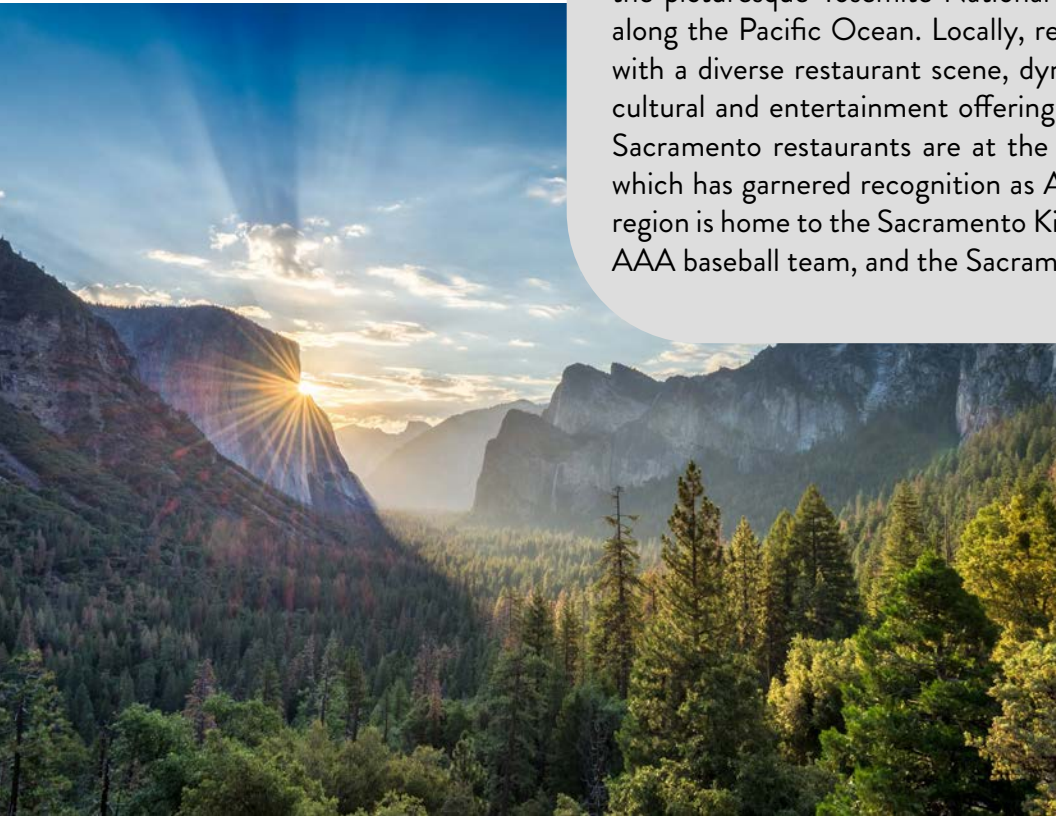
