The Wasatch Front is a geological area consisting of four counties-Salt Lake, Utah, Davis and Weber-and spans from Ogden City to the north to Provo south with Salt Lake City in-between. 2.7 million people, or 77% of Utah's population reside along the Wasatch Front. 

Employment expanded 3.1% year-over-year, making the state the national leader for job growth. Today, there are over 7,000 tech and life sciences companies located in Utah. 
