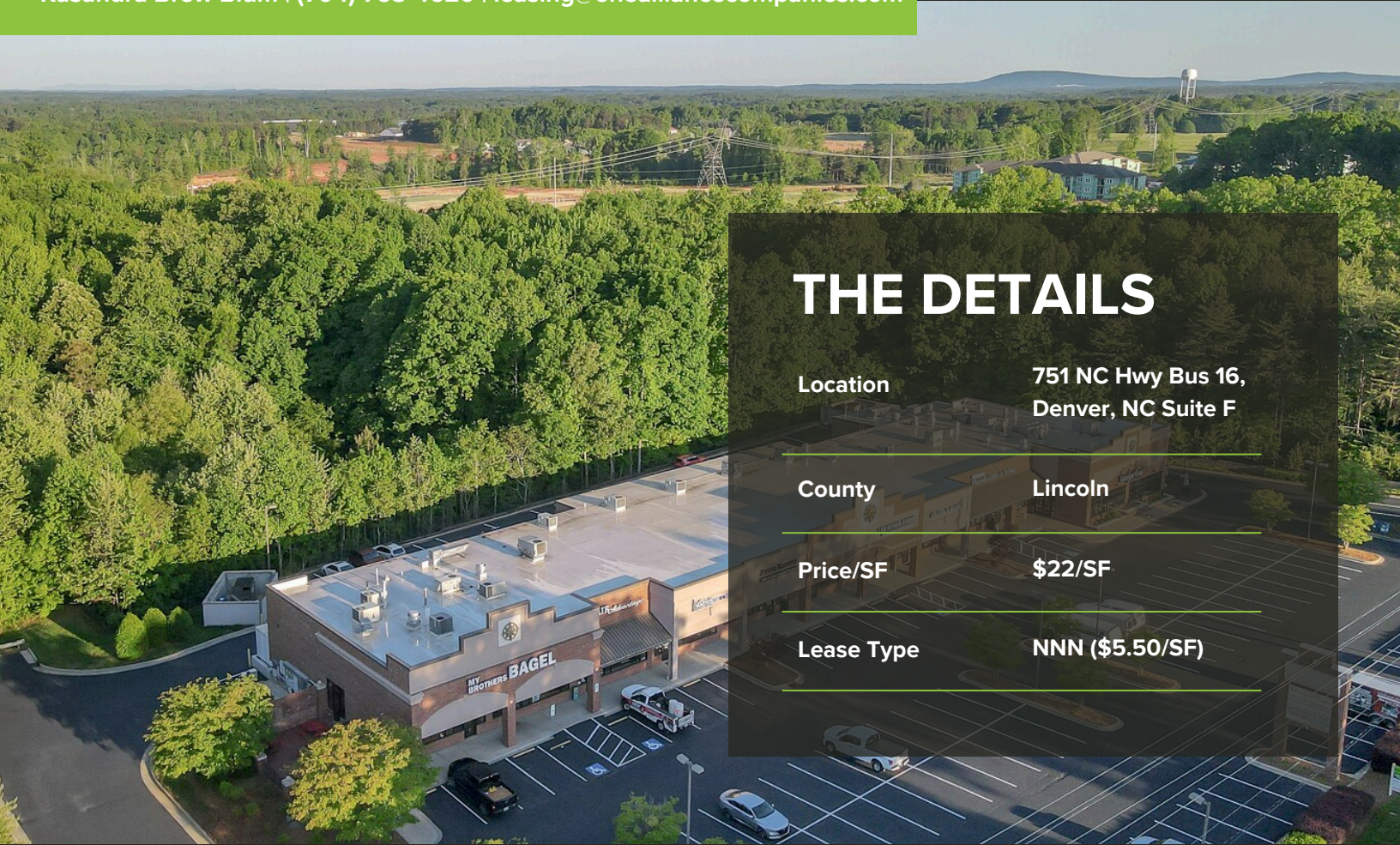

DENVER, NC

Denver is located in the northeast corner of Lincoln County, in west-central North Carolina. The community is situated along North Carolina State Highway 16, approximately 25 miles north of downtown Charlotte and 15 miles southeast of Newton.

As of the 2020 census, Denver has a population of 2,697 residents. The median age of residents is approximately 46.5 years, with an average individual income of \$55,020.

Denver is located near Lake Norman, North Carolina's largest man-made lake. The lake is a popular spot for boating, fishing, swimming, and other recreational activities. This proximity to the lake has led to Denver's growth as a residential area for people seeking waterfront homes or a lakeside lifestyle.

In addition to parks like Beatty's Ford Park and Rock Springs Nature Preserve, the area is known for its beautiful nature trails, boat ramps, and scenic views of Lake Norman. Visitors often enjoy hiking, fishing, kayaking, and paddleboarding on the lake.

The community is served by NC Highway 16, with two routes running northwest to southeast through Denver: "Old 16" (16 Business) and "New 16" (16 Bypass).
