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

BINGHAMTON (WBNG) -- The City of Binghamton is calling for projects and proposals to revitalize Clinton Street and the surrounding neighborhood.

The announcement comes ahead of Binghamton's upcoming funding application for round eight of the New York State Downtown Revitalization Initiative.

The city will apply for this year's DRI, which will award \$10 million in funding for 10 communities across the state. The money is to be used for transformative projects.

Binghamton officials said it will focus on investments in the area of Clinton Street between Front Street and Jarvis Street to transform derelict properties and vacant lots into what the community needs and wants.
