Polk.

From the Annual Mule Day Parade that attracts over two hundred thousand spectators from across the country and abroad, to the seasonal Farmers' Fresh Market, to the Southern Fried Festival, to the Annual Main Street Christmas Parade – there's always a reason to shop, dine, and play in downtown Columbia.

Since 1983, Columbia Main Street has been working to re-energize historic downtown Columbia by brining life back to the place that was once the area's primary hub of social and economic activity. One of Tennessee's first five Main Street communities, Columbia Main Street implements a rejuvenation process that involves four major components: a design plan that recaptures the historic flavor and beauty of the community through restoration, the attraction of a viable mix of businesses to cater to community needs, ongoing promotion of the downtown district, and a strong organization to spearhead the effort.

About The Tennessee Main Street Program

The Tennessee Main Street (TMS) Program serves as a statewide resource for communities seeking to revitalize and manage their traditional downtowns. TMS designated communities have developed an organization specifically focused on downtown revitalization and are effectively applying the National Main Street Center's comprehensive Four-Point Approach. TMS is administered by the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development's Community and Rural Development Division. It follows the proven downtown revitalization model developed by the National Main Street Center, a subsidiary of the National Trust for Historic Preservation.
