This trend to plan a [\(re\)creation vacation](#) in 2025—a much-needed escape that recreates the adventure and connectedness of times past—is sweeping across campers, and they're looking for specific amenities to help them re-experience the joys of childhood camping.

One of the main features that came up repeatedly in our survey findings was the campfire. From cooking on the fire to telling stories around it, campers clearly prioritize this iconic symbol of connection and slowing down. Building and cooking over the fire are even the top two outdoor skills people want to pass on most to future generations. These are important signals to upgrade your campfire experience.

Consider other updates or upgrades you can implement to tap into the emotions of connectedness and old-school camping joys. Get creative—from leaning into retro vibes in your marketing materials or on-site events, to highlighting nostalgic activities in your adverts, to offering items like campfire conversation starter cards or a day-trip itinerary that speaks to campers' wanderlust. These special touches make all the difference.

As you enhance your amenities, keep in mind that campers are most seeking stress relief (68%), quality family time (64%), and reconnecting with nature (58%) on their trips in 2025. Create Cozy Campfire Experiences

1. Premium Fire Pit Areas

The campfire pit is a top nostalgia-evoking amenity for campers (72%), so enhance your fire pit zones with comfortable seating, enhancing the communal aspect of camping and providing a cozy atmosphere for evening gatherings.

Invest in high-quality fire pits with stylish designs that provide a focal point for socializing and relaxation. Furnish the area with comfortable seating, such as Adirondack chairs or benches, to create a more comfortable and communal experience, and implement thoughtful landscaping and lighting for a picturesque and inviting ambiance.

2. Gourmet S'mores Stations

Create a dedicated area with a variety of high-quality chocolate, artisanal marshmallows, and gourmet graham crackers that allows campers to customize their s'mores with premium ingredients.

Consider offering unique flavor options such as dark chocolate or sea salt caramel, or even specialty cookies as alternatives to traditional graham crackers. Additional toppings like nuts, fruit, or spreads can further enhance the gourmet experience. Campground owners can collaborate with local vendors or chocolatiers to source unique and regional ingredients, adding a local flair to the s'more offerings.

3. Additional Touches for the Campfire Experience

Consider features that help campers spend meaningful time around the campfire and with each other, such as firewood bundles, s'mores kits, or equipment that help them build and cook over the campfire.

For another special touch, offer campfire prompts and questions (for rent or purchase) to encourage conversation and deepen bonds between family and friends. One in two guests (48%) is excited to re-experience telling stories around the campfire, so help them create these unforgettable memories at your campground.

4. Upgraded Restroom and Shower Facilities

In a previous edition of the [Campspot Outdoor Almanac](#), we found toilets to be the number one most important bathroom amenity across all types of campers, and sanitation—campers' most desired amenity in 2025—grew by 5% year over year.

Explore options to upgrade restroom and shower facilities to offer a touch of luxury, enhancing camper comfort during their stay.

Creating luxury restroom and shower facilities at campgrounds involves a thoughtful approach to design, amenities, and sustainability. Campgrounds aiming for a more upscale experience can invest in high-quality materials and modern architecture to elevate the look and feel of these facilities. Spacious, private shower stalls with rainfall shower heads, heated floors, and upscale toiletries are a few features that can help create a more luxurious experience.

Look into energy-efficient lighting, water-saving technologies, and sustainable building materials to align with the growing demand for environmentally conscious camping experiences.

Keep up with the demands of modern campers by providing reliable high-speed internet and tech-charging stations throughout the campground. Even if campers decide to digitally detox, give them the ability to choose whether they stay plugged in or disconnect.

This allows you to help all groups of campers meet their goals, especially when most (61%) seek a balance between enjoying modern conveniences and traditional rustic charm.

6. Offer Resources for Those Going Device-Free

One in three (32%) campers miss the screen-free aspect of childhood, so appeal to these campers with resources that help them take a break from their devices, such as maps, itineraries, and recommendations for nearby attractions.

Binoculars, disposable cameras, and other tools can be great options to stock in your campground store as well.

Embrace Sustainable Practices

7. Solar-Powered and DarkSky Approved Lighting

Implement environmentally-friendly lighting solutions by incorporating solar-powered fixtures that reduce your carbon footprint. Not only does this align with the growing demand for sustainable and green camping options, but it also lowers operational costs over time.

Solar-powered lighting can also enhance safety and visibility within the campground during the evening. The absence of wiring and the ability to place lights in more remote or scenic areas of the campground provide flexibility in design and contribute to a more well-lit camping setting.

Appeal to families and campers craving sparks of adventure by adding zip lines or adventure courses within the campground, providing an adrenaline-filled experience for campers of all ages.



Have mats available with disinfecting spray or wipes and perhaps even some calming music to set a relaxing mood. Offering scheduled yoga classes or meditation sessions led by qualified instructors can further elevate the experience, appealing to individuals seeking relaxation and holistic well-being during their camping getaway. Promoting these amenities through marketing materials and online platforms can attract a niche market of wellness-conscious campers.

13. Wellness Retreat Packages

Tap into the burgeoning wellness tourism trend by offering specialized wellness retreat packages as a distinctive amenity. These packages can include a blend of outdoor activities that promote physical and mental well-being, such as guided hikes, yoga sessions in scenic locations, and meditation classes. Incorporate healthy and locally sourced meal options to complement the theme.

14. Water and Spa-Like Sanctuaries

You could even add a touch of luxury by creating a spa with relaxing amenities like hot tubs or saunas. Campers can indulge in water-based activities during the day and unwind in the spa-like atmosphere in the evenings.

15. Unique Events

Beyond traditional camping activities, consider organizing events like outdoor movie nights, themed weekends, nature walks with knowledgeable guides, and stargazing sessions. In fact, given that the [1980s are the decade campers most wish to escape back to](#), you can host parties or movie nights with an '80s theme.

Another fun idea is to host a concert series featuring local artists, bringing live music to the great outdoors. You could set up a natural amphitheater or designated performance area within the campground that allows campers to enjoy the magic of music under the stars. A vibrant community event like this could also attract a broader audience to your campground.

16. Stargazing Stations

Designating a stargazing area away from artificial lights and with unobstructed views of the night sky can help campers feel more connected to nature and the cosmos. Organize stargazing sessions led by local astronomers or naturalists who can point out constellations, planets, and celestial phenomena. Take it a step further by offering telescope rentals or setting up communal telescopes, or allow campers to rent tablets that have stargazing applications pre-loaded, enabling an educational and user-friendly stargazing experience. Even simple educational materials like star maps can enrich the experience.
