



SEAPORTS

- JAXPORT is one of the region's four deep-water ports and is the #1 container terminal in Florida
- Over \$100 million planned in infrastructure improvements, including upgrading to 100-gauge cranes
- The \$484 million project to deepen the harbor to 47 feet is two years ahead of schedule with anticipated completion in 2023
- Boasts the widest shipping channel in the Southeast, enough room for two ships to pass at the same time
- JAXPORT cargo statistics
 - 10.9 million tons of cargo in 2019, a 4% increase from 2018
 - 1.3 million containers
 - 700,000± vehicles handled



ECONOMY

Florida's economy would be the 18th largest in the world, if it were a country. It surpasses most in its access to global markets, multimodal transportation, AAA credit rating, and the scale and scope of industry assets. No longer reliant on tourism, Florida's economy to industries includes financial & professional services, life sciences, tech, and manufacturing. Florida also has the fourth largest workforce in the US, gaining over 200,000 jobs in the last year. Florida's unemployment rate reduced to 3%, which is 0.6 percentage points less than the national unemployment rate. Florida's annual job growth has continuously exceeded the nation's rate and is projected to add an additional 1,049,947 jobs by 2025.

POPULAR TRENDS

Florida has the fourth fastest growing population in the United States, surpassing the national growth rate of 5.5%, and the second fastest in the South Atlantic. Florida's current population is estimated to be over 20.9 million residents, making it the third most populated state, after California and Texas. This translates into an 11.6% growth in the population since 2010, according to the US Census Bureau. By 2030, the Sunshine State is projected to add an additional 1.8 million residents.
