

MSA DEMOGRAPHICS

The Cincinnati metro currently has a population of 2.2 million and 859,000 households. The metro is expected to add nearly 31,000 people (1.4% growth) and approximately 16,100 households (1.9% growth) over the next five years. Household incomes slightly above the national median (\$64,900) and relatively affordable home prices allow 66% of households to own a residence.

5-MILE DEMOGRAPHICS

POPULATION

In 2022, the population within 5 miles was 136,813. The population has increased by 20.13% since 2000. It is estimated that the population will be 140,381 in 5 years (a 2.61% increase). The average age is 41.08.

HOUSEHOLDS

There are currently 53,088 households within 5 miles. The number of households has increased by 28.11% since 2000. In 5 years, an increase of 3.54% is projected (54,969).

INCOME

The median household income within 5 miles was \$105,323 in 2022, nearly double the U.S. average. This number has increased by 51.18% since 2000 and is estimated to be \$121,996 in 5 years (15.83% increase). The average household income is \$144,643, compare to the U.S. average of \$96,357.

EMPLOYMENT

In 2022, there were 178,598 employees within 5 miles. 76.41% have white-collar occupations, and 23.55% have blue-collar occupations. Average time traveled to work is 26 minutes.



CINCINNATI OVERVIEW

The Cincinnati metro is a 15-county region located within portions of Ohio, Kentucky and Indiana that maintains a population of nearly 2.2 million. Nine Fortune 500 companies are located in the metro and provide thousands of jobs: Kroger, Cintas, Procter & Gamble, Macy's, Fifth Third Bancorp, AK Steel Holding, American Financial Group, Cincinnati Financial and Western & Southern Financial Group. Revitalization and the addition of bars, restaurants and services downtown and in the Over-the-Rhine neighborhood have drawn millennials into the urban core.


Companies are drawn to the region's low cost of doing business, while employees enjoy a relatively affordable place to live.
