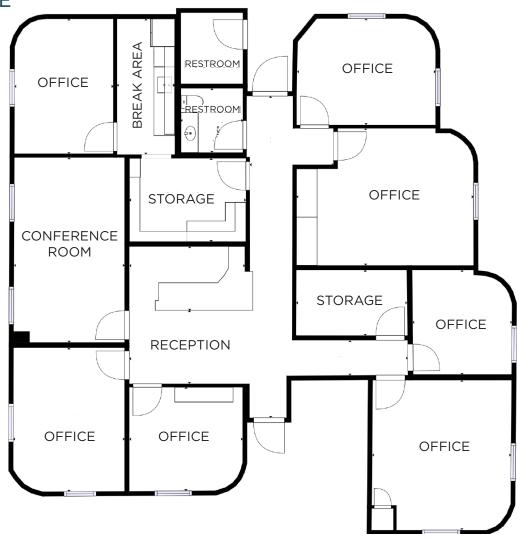
FLOOR PLAN

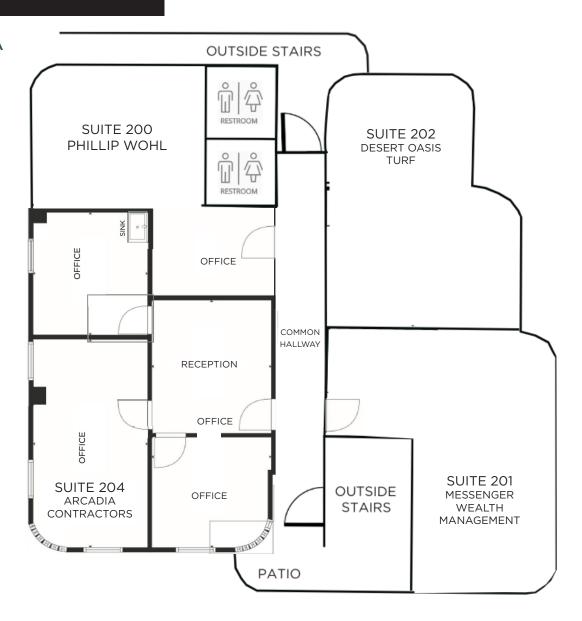
FLOOR PLAN
