MERGING HERITAGE AND FORWARD-THINKING MODERNISM

AN ICONIC LANDMARK, the Station serves as a vibrant symbol of Downtown connecting the historic fabric of the past to the present through arts, culture, transit and community. Conceived on a grand scale, Los Angeles Union Station is the largest railroad passenger terminal in the Western United States and is often regarded as “the last of the great train stations.”

THE LOS ANGELES UNION STATION, completed in 1939, is the largest railroad passenger terminal in the Western United States. Designed by the architectural team of John and Donald Parkinson, the Station boasts a unique combination of Spanish Colonial, Mission Revival, and Art Deco styles, which has come to be known as Mission Moderne. While it thrived during World War II, the rise of cars and planes led to declining passenger numbers. Nevertheless, Union Station remains an iconic and historic part of LA's transportation scene. Designated a Los Angeles Historic-Cultural Monument in 1972 and listed in national and state registers, it represents the spirit of the California dream and a vibrant arts and culture destination.

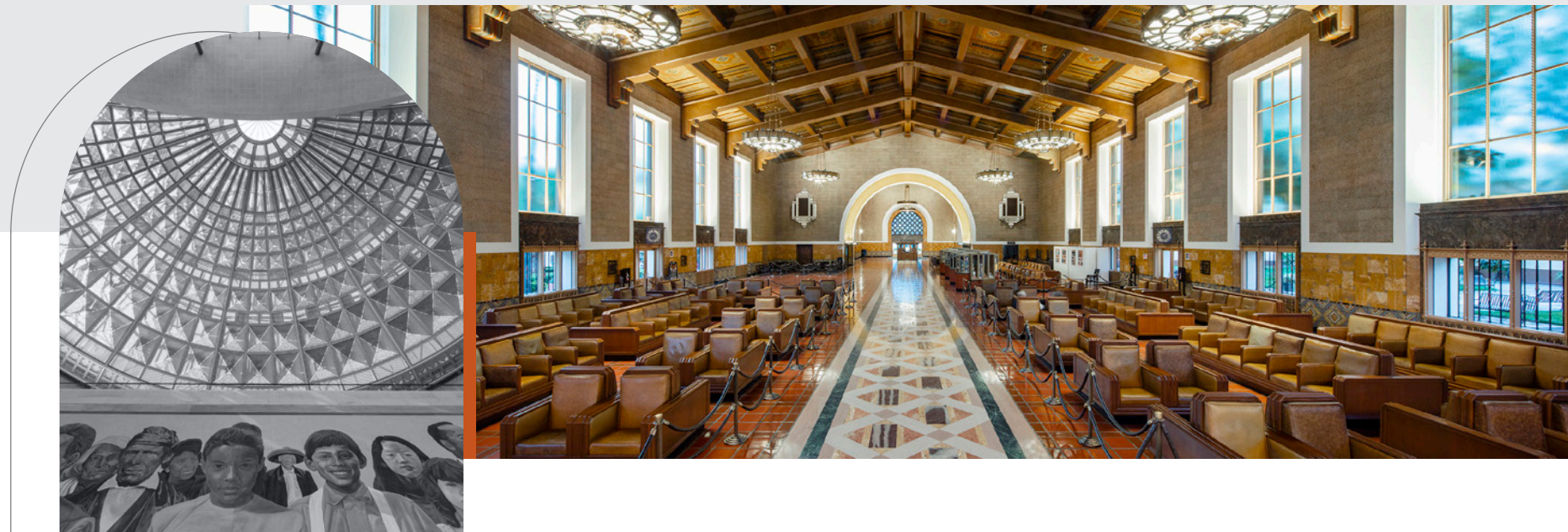


LAST OF THE GREAT TRAIN STATIONS



MAIN TERMINAL

THE MAIN TERMINAL, completed in 1939, is a 161,000-square-foot reinforced concrete structure featuring an H-shaped plan. Its main north-south axis includes the Northwest Office, Ticket Concourse, Clock Tower, Main Arcade, and the former Fred Harvey restaurant, with arcades at each end. Perpendicular to this axis are the Waiting Room and North and South patios. The design showcases a blend of Spanish Colonial and Mission Revival styles, accented by Art Deco elements, highlighted by a 127-foot clock tower, clay tile roofs, and decorative wrought iron grilles. Subterranean parking and basements are also part of the facility.

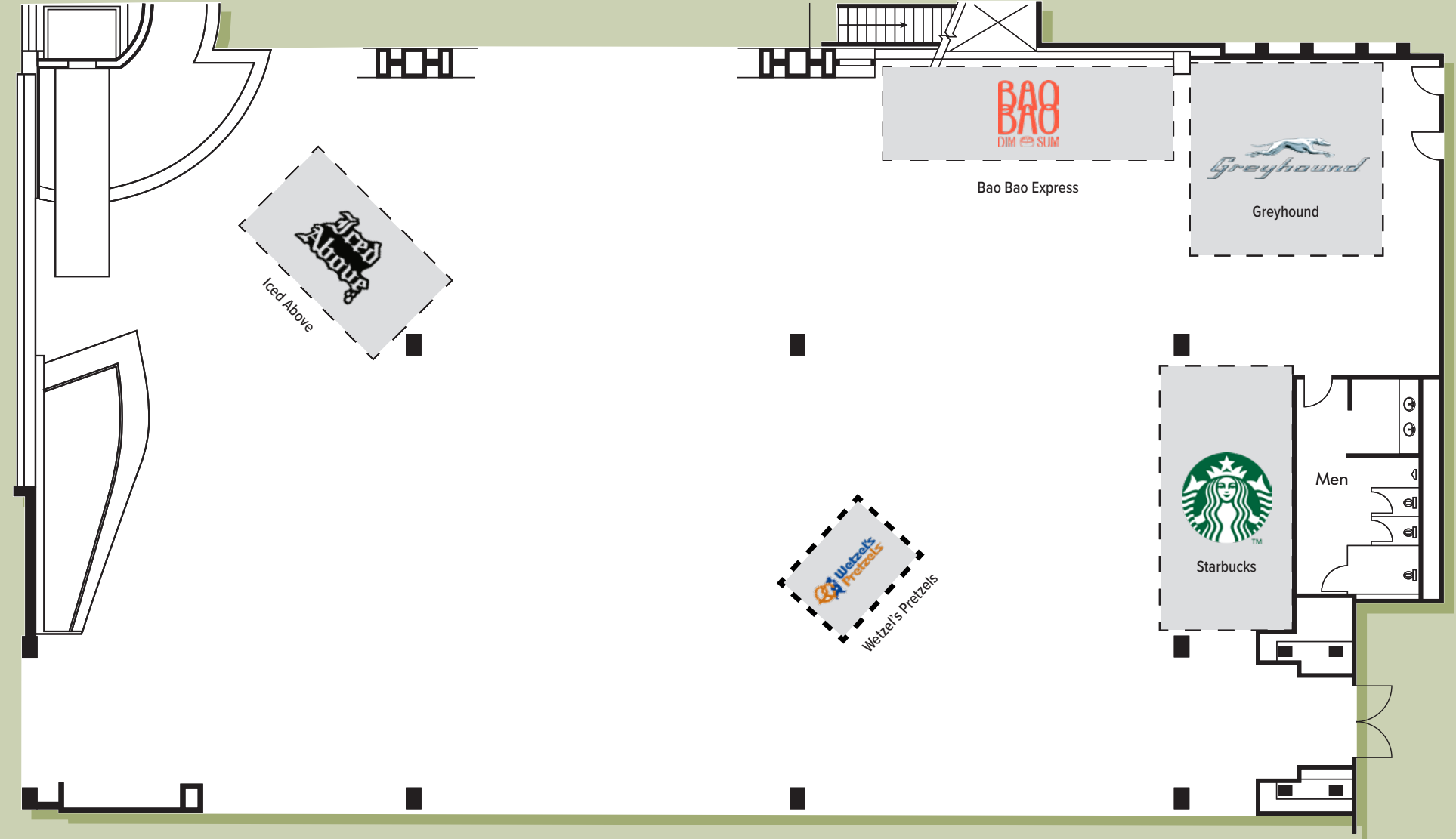




UNION STATION EAST is a part of the broader Union Station complex. 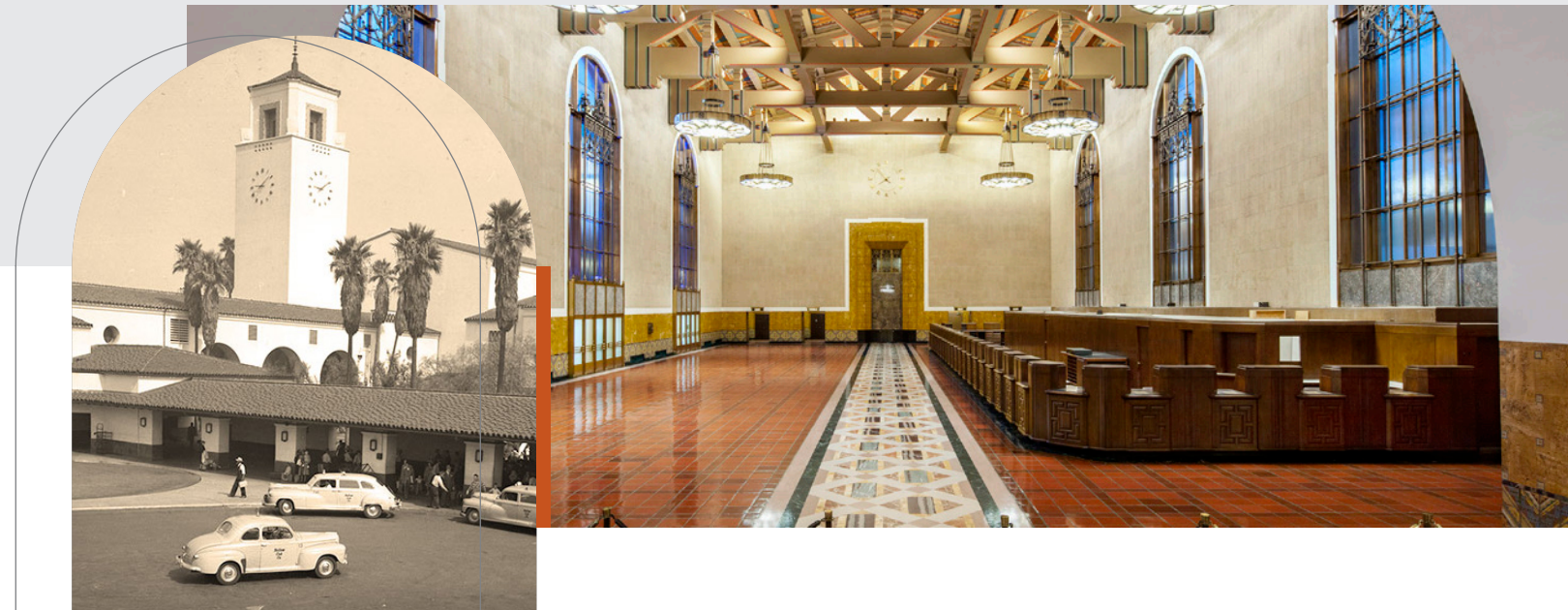
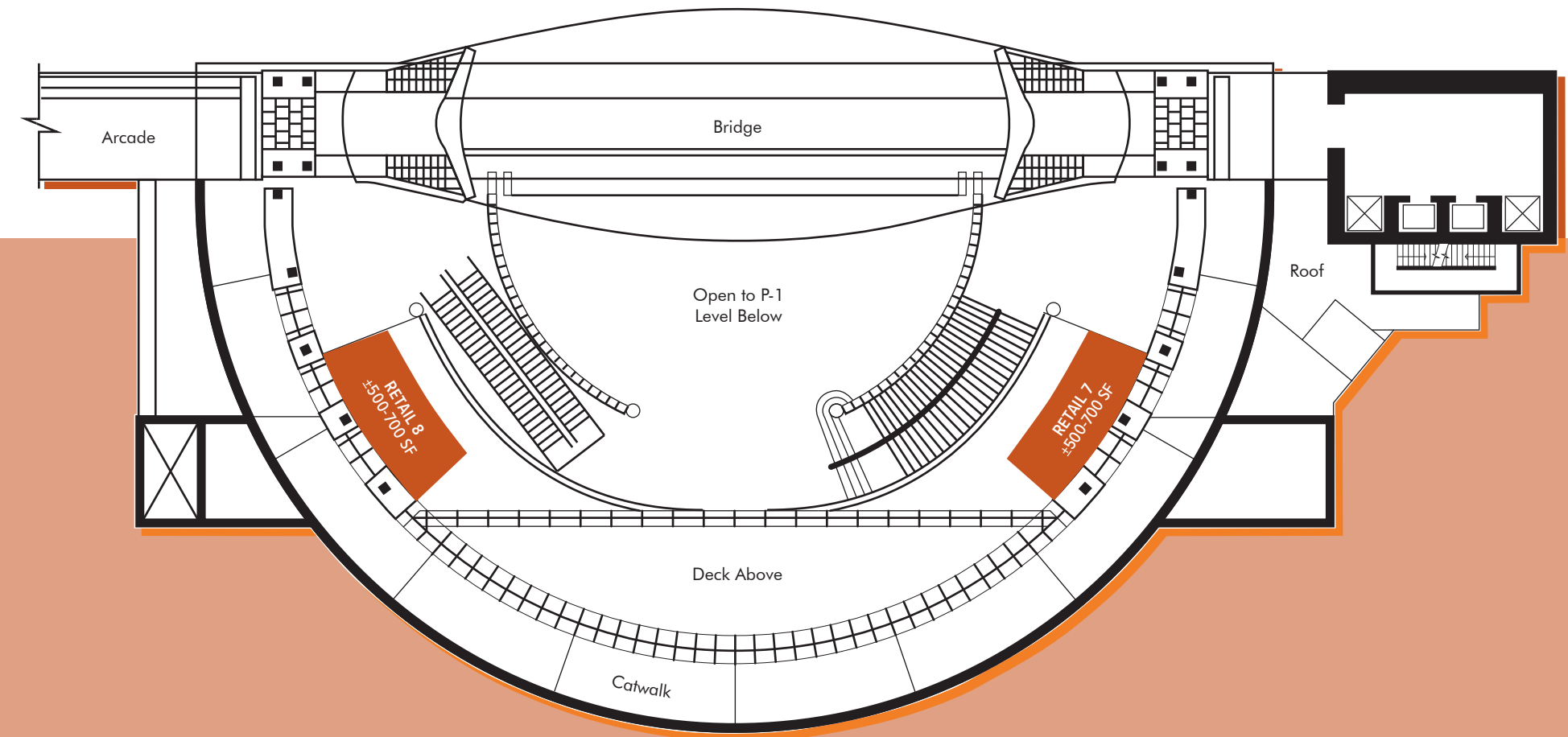

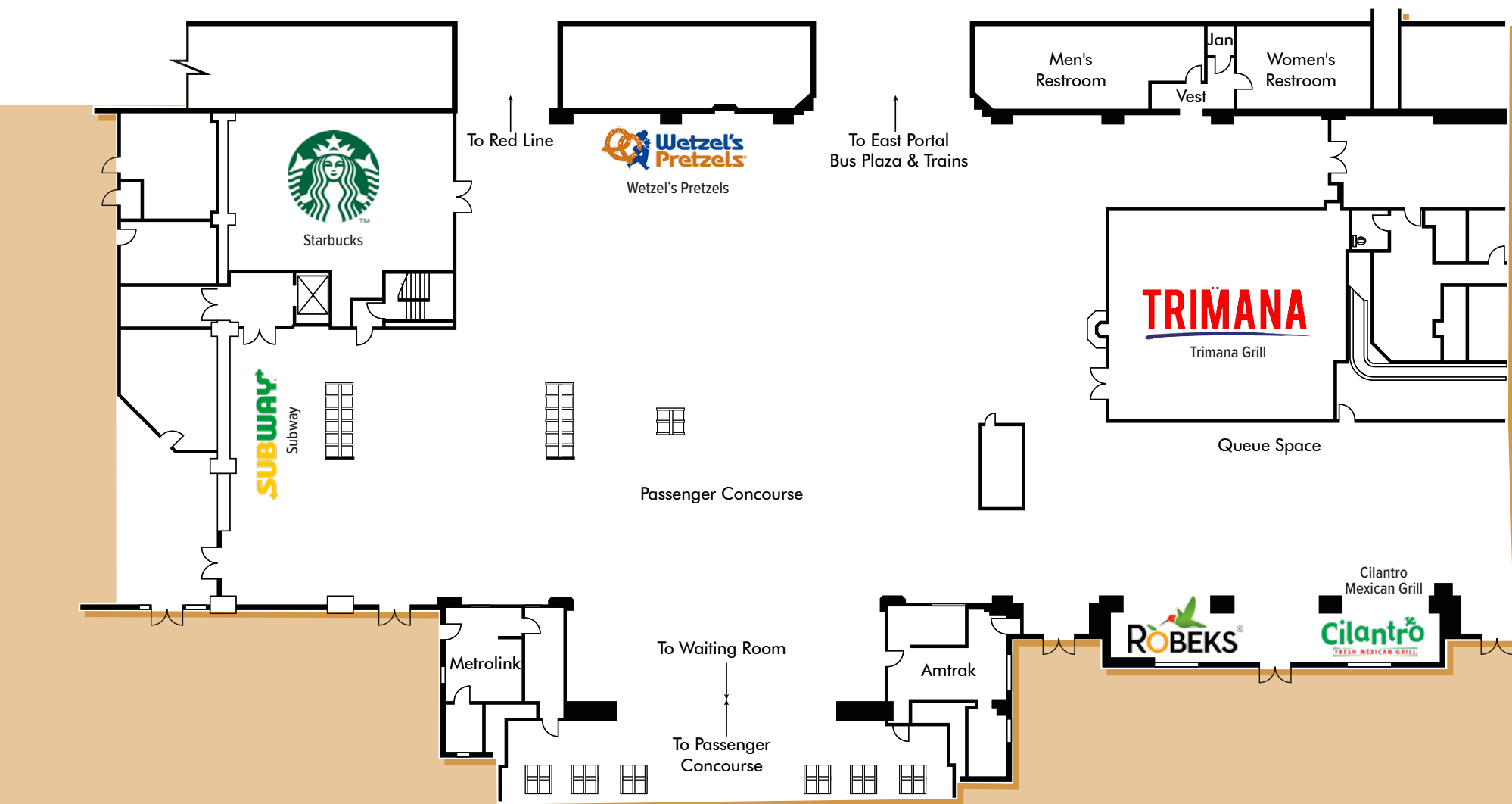
UNION STATION EAST features a modern design by McClaren/Vasques, which seamlessly connects Union Station to the Patsaouras Transit Plaza. This area is not only a transit hub but also a cultural highlight, showcasing several extraordinary pieces of Metro Art. A standout feature is the impressive 87-foot-high etched glass ceiling, which beautifully mimics patterns found throughout the Station, enhancing the aesthetic experience for visitors and passengers alike. This blend of functionality and artistic expression reinforces Union Station’s role as a vibrant gateway to Los Angeles.

PASSENGER CONCOURSE

THE SPACE HOUSES ticketing, eateries and leads into the main Passageway to the train arrivals and departures. In terms of its design, the concourse's polychromatic palette aligns with the decorative color scheme found throughout the Station. The flooring is comprised of integrally colored red, gray, tan, yellow, orange and black concrete tiles while the ceiling is supported by columns featuring flared capitals at the top and multi-colored glazed tile at the base.

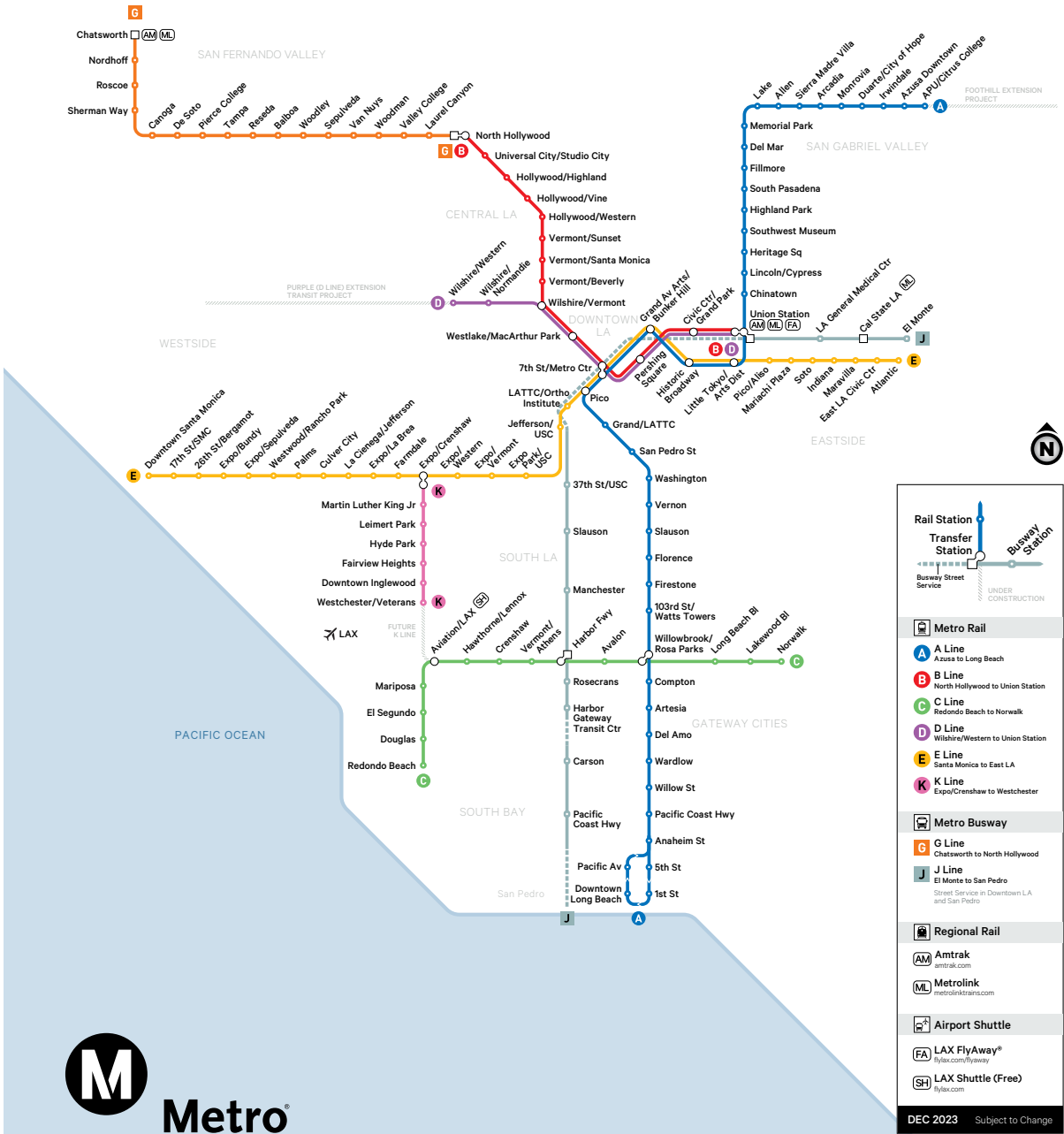
