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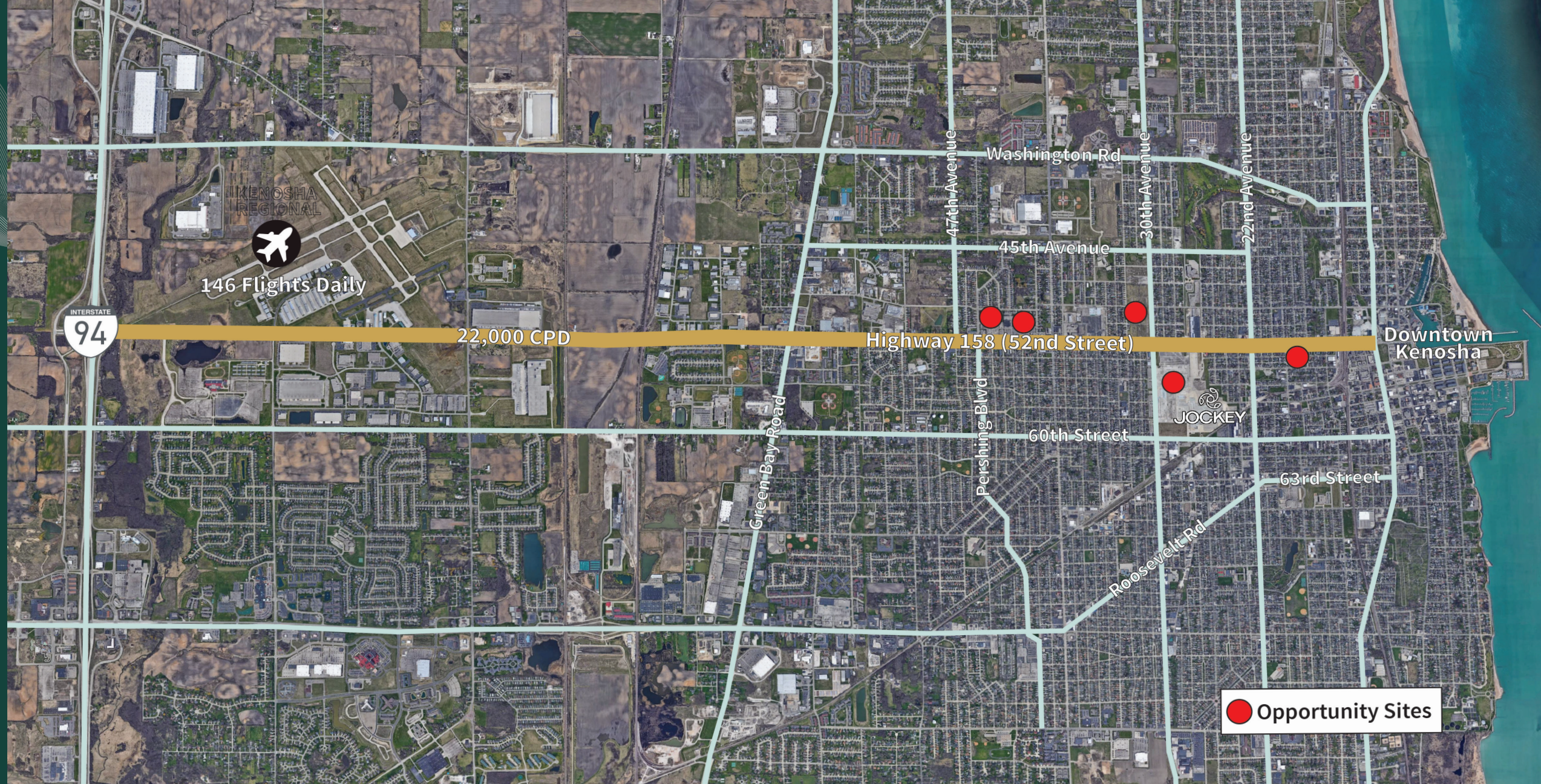


CITY OF KENOSHA

The fourth-largest metro of Wisconsin, Kenosha County is located just 50 miles north of Chicago and 31 miles south of Milwaukee. The City of Kenosha, the largest city located on the I-94 corridor between Chicago and Milwaukee, is the economic hub of Kenosha County. With a population of more than 100,000, Kenosha also enjoys a strong tourism market, with visitor spending growing 15 consecutive quarters. In 2016, total business sales reached \$345 million and sustained 3,249 jobs.

The City of Kenosha is home to the nationally recognized corporate headquarters of Jockey International and Snap-On Tools. Amazon constructed a regional fulfillment and sortation facility consisting of 1.5 million square feet which employs over 3,000 workers. Kenosha's strategic location on the I-94 corridor has generated a substantial amount of investment in the advanced manufacturing, food and logistic sectors.

Highway 158 (52nd Street) is Kenosha's primary entrance linking I-94 to the downtown and Lake Michigan. A variety of development and redevelopment sites provides opportunities for investment along this heavily traveled roadway.

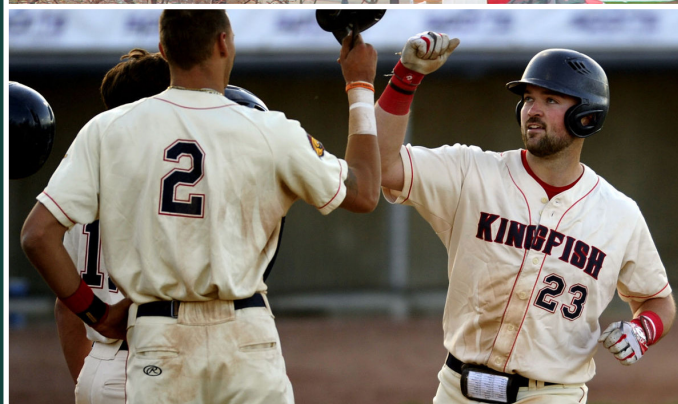
