RESOLUTION NO. 02-24

APPROVING THE SPHERE OF INFLUENCE AMENDMENT (ADDITION) TO THE CITY OF COACHELLA ("POCKET 7")

LAFCO 2023-07-4

BE IT RESOLVED AND DETERMINED by the Riverside Local Agency 8 Formation Commission ("Riverside LAFCO" or "the Commission") in 9 regular session assembled on February 22, 2024, that LAFCO 2023-10 07-4-Sphere of Influence Amendment (addition) to the City of 11 Coachella ("Pocket 7") consisting of approximately 240.6 acres, 12 qenerally located west of Calhoun St., east of Jackson St., north 13 of 52nd Ave., and a quarter mile south of 50th Avenue, within 14 unincorporated territory adjacent to the City of Coachella ("City"), as depicted in Exhibit "A," attached hereto 16 incorporated herein by this reference, is approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND FOUND THAT:

- The sphere of influence amendment was initiated by 19∥resolution of application by the City of Coachella.
- Whereas a municipal service review that included the subject agency was prepared and reviewed by this Commission pursuant to Government Code section 56430 and determinations were made 23 thereon on July 28, 2022.
- 3. City, as lead agency under the California 25 Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"), approved by Resolution No. 26 2023-49 certified an Addendum to Environmental Impact Report ("EIR"), State Clearinghouse No. 2009021007 for the City of Coachella General Plan 2035 and the City of Coachella General Plan

1 Map and General Plan Land Use Designation for three (3) areas 2 evaluated as part the General Planning area in the Certified 2015 3 Program EIR but for which no General Land Use Designation was 4 identified on July 26, 2023.

A Notice of Determination was filed and posted on $6\|$ September 18, 2023, for the Addendum for the General Plan Amendment No. 23-03 and Environmental Assessment No. 23-03 Project with all 8 appropriate filing fees paid.

In certifying the Addendum to EIR, the City has complied $10\parallel$ with the provisions of CEQA and all appropriate State Guidelines. 11 The Commission, as responsible agency under CEQA, has reviewed and 12 considered the environmental documentation.

- That, based on the environmental documentation prepared 14||by the Lead Agency, and pursuant to CEQA Guidelines sections 15091 15 and 15096(h):
- Riverside LAFCO has more limited approval and 17||implementing authority over the project and thus serves 18 responsible agency pursuant to the requirements of CEQA. In its 19 limited role as responsible agency under CEQA, Riverside LAFCO has 20 received, reviewed, and considered the environmental documentation 21 and Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program, and all oral and 22 written comments thereon and reached its own conclusions on whether 23 and how to approve the portion of the project over which Riverside 24 LAFCO has jurisdiction.
- All the procedures of CEQA and the CEQA Guidelines 26 have been met, and the Addendum to the EIR is sufficiently detailed 27 so that all of the potentially significant effects of the project on the environment and measures necessary to avoid or substantially

1 lessen such effects have been evaluated in accordance with CEQA. There are no feasible alternatives or mitigation measures within Riverside LAFCO's powers that would substantially lessen or avoid any significant effect the entire project would have on the environment.

- The Commission has verified that the Addendum to the adequately analyzes the potential environmental 8 associated with the proposed sphere of influence change and has considered the environmental impacts of the project as shown in the 10||EIR and Addendum. While, as noted above, the entire City of Coachella General Plan will result in significant impacts that 12 cannot be mitigated to a level of less than significant, Riverside 13 LAFCO finds that there are no direct or indirect environmental 14 effects of the proposed sphere of influence changes. Therefore, 15 pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15096(q), there are no 16||mitigation measures to be adopted by Riverside LAFCO for the 17||proposed sphere of influence change. On these bases, Riverside 18 LAFCO finds that all required procedures of CEQA and other legal 19 prerequisites to the Commission's approval of its portion of the 20 project have been met and concurs with and adopts the environmental 21 findings of the lead agency.
- 5. In its limited role as responsible agency, based on the 23 environmental documentation prepared by the Lead Agency, 24 pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Sections 15162, 15163 and 15164, some changes and additions are necessary to the EIR, but none of the 26 conditions in CEQA Guidelines section 15162 are met, the Commission 27 further finds the following:
 - There have not been any substantial changes proposed

1 to the project as analyzed in the EIR as modified by the Addendum that require major revisions of the CEQA documents because of new 3 significant environmental effects or a substantial increase in the severity of previously identified significant effects.

- There have not been any substantial changes with 6 respect to the circumstances under which the proposed project is undertaken that require major revisions of the CEQA documents, due 8 to the involvement of new significant environmental effects or a 9 substantial increase in the severity of previously identified 10 significant effects.
- There is new information of substantial c. 12 importance, which was not known and could not have been known with 13| the exercise of reasonable diligence at the time the EIR and/or 14 Addendum were adopted, that shows any of the following:
- (1)The project will have one or more significant 16 effects not discussed in the EIR or Addendum;
- (2) Significant effects previously examined will be 18 substantially more severe than shown in the EIR or Addendum;
- Mitigation measures or alternatives previously (3) 20 found not to be feasible would in fact be feasible, and would 21 substantially reduce one or more significant effects of the project, 22 but the project proponents decline to adopt the mitigation measure 23 or alternative;
- Mitigation measures or alternatives which are 25 considerably different from those analyzed in the EIR or Addendum 26 would substantially reduce one or more significant effects on the 27 environment, but the project proponents decline to adopt the 28 mitigation measure or alternative.

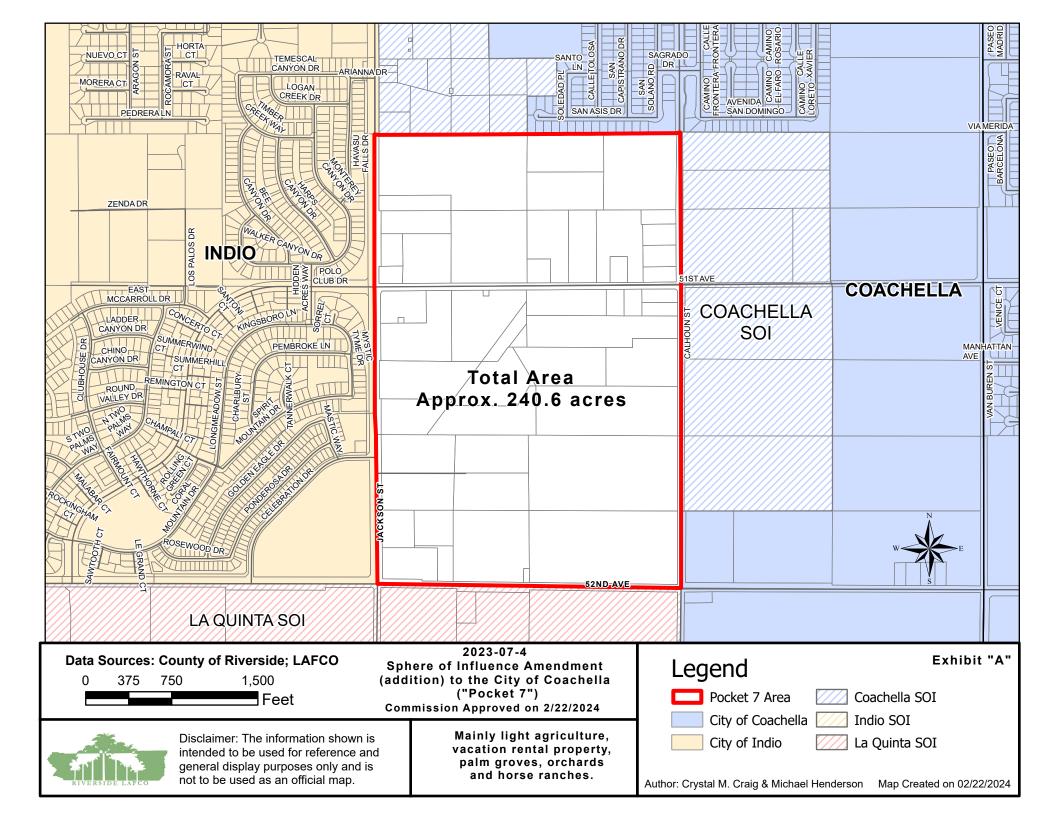

STATEMENT OF DETERMINATIONS LAFCO 2023-07-4

Sphere of Influence Amendment (addition) to the City of Coachella ("Pocket 7")

1. THE PRESENT AND PLANNED LAND USES IN THE AREA, INCLUDING AGRICULTURAL AND OPEN SPACE USES:

The proposed sphere amendment includes portions of the community of Vista Santa Rosa. Vista Santa Rosa Community Council (CC) came into existence in 2000, becoming its own entity separate and apart from Thermal CC.

The P7 area is a predominantly agricultural community with equestrian land uses that is located easterly of La Quinta, southerly of Indio and westerly of the City of Coachella. Approximately half of the acreage within the proposed sphere expansion is vacant, much of which is undeveloped infill parcels with luxury estates/vacation rentals and orchards/palm groves.

Currently, the entire P7 SOI area consists of approximately 246 acres of inhabited territory. Existing uses in P7 include small scale agricultural, low-density estate residential, equestrian uses, neighborhood commercial, and animal keeping.

The subject area is located adjacent to the existing City of Coachella boundary. More specifically, the area is adjacent to the single-family neighborhoods of La Colonia and Mariposa Pointe, which are developed at a density range of up to 6 dwelling units an acre. The area is also adjacent to the Trilogy gated community of single-family residences.

On July 26, 2023, the City Council prepared a General Plan Amendment for the SOI amendment of P7 and approved General Land Use Designations.

The current County General Plan Land Use Designations are Estate Density Residential (EDR) and Commercial Retail (CR). The City's General Plan Designation is Estate Rancho at (1.2 du/acre).

The current County zoning classifications are Light Industrial (A-1), Light Agricultural (A-1-20) and Scenic Highway Commercial (C-P-S). The City's proposed zoning classification is Suburban Retail District for consistency with the County land uses. See Exhibit "A" (Aerial).

Commission Policy 1.2.1 *Preserve the Physical and Economic Integrity of Agricultural Lands*. City SOI shall be directed away from substantial areas of prime agricultural land, unless:

- a. The result would not facilitate an orderly development pattern; and,
- b. The city's general plan allows for the continued operation of agricultural uses and provides guidelines for the ultimate development of agricultural land at the time the use is terminated, or development is proposed.

The City's proposed zoning classification is consistent with the County's planned land uses, land used designations, and zoning classifications. However, a portion of P7 is also within a Williamson Act Agricultural Preserve (29 Map No. 169. Date established: January 17, 1972). See Exhibit "E." Due to Commission Policy 1.2.1, this may warrant further investigation to determine the status and significance of the Williamson Act contract and Agricultural Preserve.

2. THE PRESENT AND PROBABLE NEED FOR PUBLIC FACILITIES AND SERVICES IN THE AREA:

The County of Riverside provides general government services including building and planning, housing code enforcement, and street and road maintenance.

If the Pocket 7 area were to be annexed into the City of Coachella, then those general government services would be provided by the City of Coachella. Animal Control and Library Services would continue to be provided under City contract with the County of Riverside.

3. THE PRESENT CAPACITY OF PUBLIC FACILITIES AND ADEQUACY OF PUBLIC SERVICES WHICH THE AGENCY PROVIDED OR IS AUTHORIZED TO PROVIDE:

The City of Coachella provides a wide range of municipal services to its inhabitants, exclusive of Water and Wastewater Collection services. These include police (via contract with Riverside County Sheriff's Department), Fire (via contract with CDF/Riverside County), Public Works, Parks, Planning, Building, Waste Management (via contract) and Animal Control.

The sphere of influence amendment will not require the City to provide service into the sphere at this time but will facilitate service provision planning for the area.

The City of Coachella has adequate planning to provide for increased services and public facilities with areas which they annex. However, annexations will require feasibility reviews to ensure adequate funding is available to provide services within Pocket 7.

4. THE EXISTENCE OF ANY SOCIAL OR ECONOMIC COMMUNITIES OF INTEREST IN THE AREA:

Staff has identified to the west of the City limits the Vista Santa Rosa Community Council boundaries and to the south the County's Thermal Community Plan as depicted on Exhibits "B" within the Staff Report.

5. FOR AN UPDATE OF A SPHERE OF INFLUENCE OF A CITY OR SPECIAL DISTRICT THAT PROVIDES PUBLIC FACILITIES OR SERVICES RELATED TO SEWER, MUNICIPAL AND INDUSTRIAL WATER, OR STRUCTURAL FIRE PROTECTION, THE PRESENT AND PROBABLE NEED FOR THOSE PUBLIC FACILITIES AND SERVICES OF ANY DISADVANTAGED UNINCORPORATED COMMUNITIES (DUCS) WITHIN THE EXISTING SPHERE OF INFLUENCE:

Riverside LAFCO has determined that there are no DUCs within "P7".
