## **INTERESTING FACTS:**

---

The Wilson House is part of the Historic District of homes on this street. It is over 100 years old and has kept much of its original charm—from the hardwood floors to the front porch that's perfect for a morning coffee or evening unwind.

Grenada was founded in 1836 and is nestled between the North and South Yalobusha Rivers, making it a hub for early river travel and trade.

A few scenes from the 2001 movie *O Brother, Where Art Thou?* were filmed near Grenada!

Grenada Lake is one of the top crappie fishing destinations in the U.S. Anglers from all over the country travel here for tournaments and the beautiful views.

The area has deep Civil War roots. There are several markers and historical sites in and around Grenada, including the Old Grenada Depot.

Grenada once served as a major railway junction and played a key role in the region's growth—some old rail lines are still visible today.

**A Piece of History — Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. in Grenada**  
Did you know that Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. marched right here in Grenada, Mississippi in the 1960s?

In 1966, during the Civil Rights Movement, Dr. King led peaceful marches in Grenada to fight for equal rights, especially in response to school segregation and voter suppression. These marches were part of a larger effort to bring national attention to racial injustice in smaller Southern towns.

Many local residents risked their safety to walk alongside him and his team. His presence here left a lasting impact—and Grenada continues to honor that legacy today.

Take a moment during your visit to explore the historical markers downtown and reflect on the courage and strength of those who marched for change right here on these streets.

## Robert Johnson –

Born in 1911 in Hazlehurst, Mississippi, Johnson became a pivotal figure in the Delta blues with recordings like “Sweet Home Chicago” and “Cross Road Blues”. He died on August 16, 1938, at the age of 27, near Greenwood, under mysterious circumstances.

### A Blues Legend Nearby: Robert Johnson’s Resting Place

Just a short drive from The Wilson House Inn, music lovers can visit the final resting place of Robert Johnson, the legendary Delta bluesman whose songs like “Cross Road Blues” and “Love in Vain” shaped American music. Buried at Little Zion Missionary Baptist Church north of Greenwood, this quiet, rural site is a powerful stop for anyone interested in blues history and Mississippi’s rich cultural roots.

Robert Johnson’s grave isn’t just a resting place—it’s a pilgrimage site for music lovers worldwide. His work has influenced legends like Eric Clapton, Keith Richards, Muddy Waters, and Bob Dylan. Visiting his grave is a deeply moving reminder of his enduring legacy in American music.
