




Fourth Floor - 12,606 RSF



- Contiguous with 4th floor space


Eighth Floor - 2,316 RSF*



The Richmond MSA is home to a variety of cultural and recreational activities suitable for inhabitants with a diverse set of interests. The City of Richmond is known for its compelling history, vibrant music and arts scene, highly rated dining, and outdoor adventures. With an average commute time of 25 minutes, the city is easily traversable with additional access to the Blue Ridge Mountains, Atlantic Coast beaches, and Washington D.C. all within a two-hour drive time.



History lives in the Richmond Region. Walk among the earliest settlers at Henricus Historical Park and sit in the church where Patrick Henry gave his famous "Give Me Liberty, or Give Me Death" speech during the American Revolution. Historic Tredegar chronicles Richmond's place in the Civil War and the Richmond Slave Trail narrates the troubled times before the war and the hope that came with Emancipation. The Valentine tells the story of Richmond's people through an expansive permanent collection and creative special exhibits.

The James River cuts through Richmond and is surrounded by a vast park system with well-maintained trails for hiking and biking. Convenient trail-to-water access allows for fishing, kayaking, and leisurely pursuits. The main section of the James River Park extends 2.6 miles through downtown Richmond and connects to the Virginia Capital Trail, a 52-mile multiuse trail that stretches from Richmond to Williamsburg. Additional attractions include Maymont, a 100-acre Victorian estate and public park, the Virginia Museum of Fine Arts, a top-ten ranked U.S. museum and one of the largest museums in North America, and the Lewis Ginter Botanical Garden.

There's a reason National Geographic said Richmond is a place to visit for food and Condé Nast Traveler said Richmond was the "Southern Food Destination You Need to Know About." The best Richmond region restaurants are locally-owned and offer everything from farm-to-table to Asian fusion. Richmond chefs are consistently nominated for James Beard awards. With more than 30 craft breweries and more on the way, it's clear why the Wall Street Journal said Richmond "is home to one of the region's fastest growing beer scenes." Favorite beer destinations include Legend, Hardywood, Center of the Universe and Triple Crossing.
