PROXIMITY

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DOWNTOWN TORONTO

Hamilton is located just 70 kilometres (43 miles) from downtown Toronto, offering easy access by car or transit. Businesses and residents enjoy the advantages of Canada's largest city while benefiting from Hamilton's distinctive community and lifestyle.



POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION

JOHN C. MUNRO HAMILTON INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Canada's largest overnight express cargo airport and e-commerce hub operates 24/7 with no curfew, featuring dual runways of 10,000 and 6,000 feet.



PORT OF HAMILTON

The busiest Canadian port on the Great Lakes offers multi-modal connectivity with direct rail access and onsite transload facilities, handling commodities such as steel, agri-food, and bulk cargo.



FREIGHT AND PASSENGER RAIL

Hamilton's rail and freight network includes two Class 1 railways—CPKC and CN—along with seamless connections to major highways such as the 400-series, QEW, and Highway 6.



HIGHWAY 401

Highway 401, one of North America's busiest routes, is a vital transportation corridor in Ontario, linking major cities and ensuring efficient regional connectivity. It is easily accessible from Hamilton via Highway 6.



QUEEN ELIZABETH WAY

The QEW, a major Ontario highway linking Toronto with the Niagara Peninsula and Buffalo, New York, carries high traffic volumes and is easily accessible from Hamilton.

HSR and GO Transit link Hamilton to the GTHA, while the new 14-km LRT from McMaster University to Eastgate Square will boost connectivity and efficiency
