





Chief Super Market, Inc. is a regional supermarket chain that has been serving the communities of Northwest and West Central Ohio for more than 70 years. The grocery chain delivers exceptional value to its customers by offering a wide range of quality and fresh grocery items by friendly associates at competitive prices.

Clean and organized stores are filled with fresh ingredients and quality prepared foods. This fullservice grocery chain offers its customers bakery, deli, meat, seafood, prepared foods, alcohol, and floral departments. General merchandise needs include school supplies, baby needs, kitchen gadgets, household items, greeting cards, health and beauty items, and vitamins. Additional on-site services include check cashing, money orders, and postal stamps.

The supermarket chain was founded in 1951 in Defiance, Ohio, by brothers Ted and Karl Hench, along with John Nolan. The name Chief was chosen because the owners wanted their modern supermarket to be a community leader-standing for honesty, integrity, and fairness. Under those founding principles, Chief remains committed to delighting its customers, nourishing its communities, and inspiring pride in its team of associates.

Chief Super Market was purchased by Fresh Encounter in 2014, but operates with the same values and commitment to community that it always has. Fresh Encounter is owned by 3rd-generation grocers who operate 61 stores under a variety of banners across Ohio, Indiana, and Northern Kentucky.

NAPOLEON, OHIO

- A historic city located on the banks of the beautiful Maumee River in Henry County of Northwest Ohio
- 60 miles northeast of Fort Wayne; 38 miles southwest of Toledo; 100 miles south of Lansing, MI
- 8,695 city population; 27,500 county population
- \$168,000 average home price, up 5% year-over-year

ECONOMY

- Boasts a committed workforce, easy access to larger markets, and low cost of doing business as well
 as living
- 60% of all U.S. and Canadian markets are within a 600-mile radius
- State Route 24, a 4-lane highway, bisects the city and provides easy access to I-75 and I-80/90
- The largest sectors of the economy by employment include manufacturing (25%), retail trade (16%), health care and social assistance (15%), accommodation and food services (12%), and education (4%)
- Agriculture and subsequent service providers play a dominant role in the regional economy
