



AREA HIGHLIGHTS

The Fillmore Commerce Center is part of the master planned Fillmore Business Park within the City of Fillmore. The BP zoning allows for a wide variety of uses. In addition to being very business friendly, Fillmore is energetic, charming and classic. Tucked in the picturesque Santa Clara Valley, the location is directly in the path of progress and places you within easy reach to top talent, major interstate freeways, prime amenities and a thriving local culture. Affectionately referred to as the "last best small town" this charming area boasts a "turn of the 20th century" architectural style throughout its downtown area. Fillmore is also home to the one-screen Fillmore Towne Theatre, and many unique shops and businesses, including the Giessinger winery. Fillmore's historic downtown was established when the Southern Pacific built the railroad through the valley in 1887. The rail line also provided a name for the town: J. A. Fillmore was a general superintendent for the company's Pacific system. Adjacent to the railroad tracks and a much-photographed City Hall is the Railroad Visitor Center operated by the Santa Clara River Valley Railroad Historical Society, which has many displays as well as a fully operational 90-foot train turntable and several restored railroad cars.
