727 Fifteenth Street is a twelve-story, boutique office building in Washington, D.C., located within steps of the White House. Originally built in 1907, the Beaux Arts style building was part of the City Beautiful Movement in our Nation's Capital. Situated along D.C.'s historical Financial District, 727 Fifteenth Street affords tenants' immediate access to some of the region's finest restaurants and hotels in the heart of Washington.



EPICENTER OF THE DISTRICT

727 Fifteenth prominently stands on 15th Street Northwest between Pennsylvania Avenue and H Street. Only one block from the White House, the building is central to many of the District's major landmarks as well as attractive residential neighborhoods and retail offerings in the District such as the l4th Street Corridor, CityCenter, Gallery Place and Penn Quarter.





ABUNDANT AMENITIES

727 Fifteenth offers tenants a bevy of premium amenities atypical of a boutique office building in the heart of Washington, D.C. With an agreement in place with 740 Fifteenth Street, tenants of 727 Fifteenth have access to the new Bike Storage Room and recently renovated Fitness Facility with showers and lockers. On-site amenities include: Security, Building Conference Center, and Sachi - one of the District's premier night clubs.
