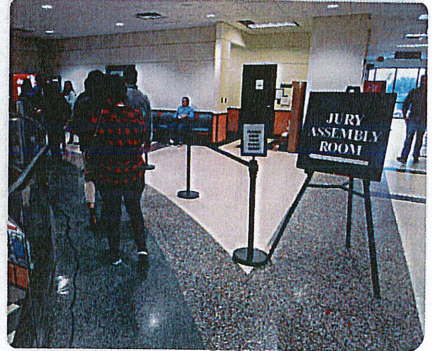
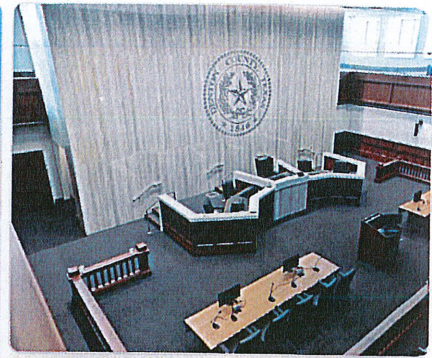


Denton County Courts Building



The building at 1450 E McKinney Street, Denton, TX 76209 is the Denton County Courts Building in Denton, Texas. Denton County +2 Here's a breakdown of its use and function:

Primary Uses & Functions

1. Courtrooms & judicial proceedings

- The facility houses numerous courts: for example the County Courts at Law No. 1 & 2, the County Criminal Courts No. 1–5, and multiple District Courts (16th, 158th, 211th, 362nd, 367th, 393rd, 431st, 442nd, 462nd, 467th, 477th, 481st).

Denton County

- It is where legal cases (civil, criminal, family, etc.) are heard and adjudicated.

2. Clerks and administrative support

- The building includes the offices of the County Clerk, District Clerk, Court Administrator, Records Management, etc. Denton County

- The Denton County District Clerk's office is located here (1st floor) and handles records for the district courts. Denton County

3. Jury Services

- Jury assembly and services are conducted at this building: e.g., the Jury Assembly Room is on the 2nd floor. Denton County
- Jurors report here for service in cases in the courts housed in the building.

Additional Notes

- The building is part of the county's facilities and serves as a central hub for most of the county's judicial system operations.
- Because it houses multiple courts and their supporting offices, it is one of the main locations where individuals would go for court filings, attending hearings, jury duty, retrieving court records, etc.
- For example, if you needed a record from a district court case, you would go to the District Clerk office at this address. Denton County

Why this matters

- If you're involved in a legal matter (as litigant, attorney, juror, etc.) in Denton County, this is a key venue.
- For public access: you can go here to access court records, attend hearings, serve as juror, or file legal documents.
- For research or historical interest: though not the historic 1896 courthouse (that is a different building) Wikipedia, this building plays the role of the modern judicial center for the county.
