





The space is stylishly minimalistic, with dim lighting, comfy seating, and a relaxed atmosphere that immediately puts you at ease. It's perfect for a night out without the pressure of dressing up too much.

The wine selection is thoughtfully curated, offering a mix of affordable and higher-end choices. Whether you're a wine connoisseur or a casual drinker, there's something to suit your palate. They also offer beer and cocktails for those who want to branch out from wine.

The food menu is more about small plates and sharable bites—think charcuterie boards, flatbreads, and other light fare—perfect for nibbling while you sip. While the food complements the drinks well, it's not the main focus, so don't expect a full meal.

Service is attentive but not intrusive, adding to the overall relaxed feel. Staff are knowledgeable about the wines and are more than happy to make recommendations based on your preferences.

But thank god they did for now we are rewarded with a world-class Italian deli and grocery the tour bus hellscape of Santa Monica frankly doesn't deserve. While anything behind the counter is order-worthy, there's one big, fat shining star. And her name is The Godmother. Genoa salami, mortadella, capicola, ham, prosciutto, and provolone all orgied together with mustard and peppers on two of the freshest slices of Italian bread this side of the Jersey Turnpike. This is the best sandwich in Los Angeles and the line wrapped around the corner knows it. (Tip: order ahead on-line and waltz by those peasants).

Huckleberry

Whether or not you care if huckleberries are in fact berries and not something Roald Dahl made up, you need to be eating at Huckleberry, a cafe and bakery in Santa Monica that feels like it's been there forever. They may not sell anything containing actual huckleberries (yep, they're real), but this is one of our favorite bakeries on the Westside. Actually, it's one of our favorite spots on the Westside. period.

In a world of grain bowls and cruffins and maple bacon goat cheese pine nut donuts, Huckleberry is decidedly old school. There's nothing on the menu that you haven't seen before - it's just that those things are better here than anywhere else. Kale caesar salads, fried egg sandwiches, chilaquiles, and cinnamon rolls are all present. But that cinnamon roll is easily one of the best in town, and the fried egg sandwich is the platonic ideal of comfort food. Which is basically what Huckleberry is: comfort in restaurant form.
