# Points of Interest



### **CHINATOWN**

A historical 15-block area situated on the western perimeter of Honolulu's financial district, this area has become the cultural hub for Honolulu's diverse arts and entertainment venues within the last 15 years. Home to a variety of cultures, Chinatown during the day has various markets for leis, antiques, exotic fruits, seafood and curiosities like the "thousand-year old egg" along with Japanese and Chinese temples and various theatres, restaurants and bars in the evening. Chinatown also holds many festivals including Chinese New Year, Mardi Gras, Cinco de Mayo, Hallowbaloo and St. Patrick's Day.

### **CHINATOWN STATION #17**

In 2012, The City and County of Honolulu commenced on the construction of the Island of Oahu's first rail system with its first segment to open in 2021 in Kapolei and is expected to eliminate an estimated 40,000 vehicles from Oahu's congested roads once fully completed in 2031. The Chinatown station, named "Holau," will serve the immediate areas of Chinatown, Pali, Downtown and outlying residential areas. The station will be located at Nimitz Highway and Kekaulike Street and is currently slated for completion as early as 2025.







### HONOLULU HARBOR

The main seaport for the State of Hawaii and Administered by the State of Hawaii Department of Transportation Harbors Division. It is one of the busiest container points in the United States as it is the main shipping link between the State and the continental United States, the Far East and the Pacific Rim, in addition to the other Hawaiian Islands. It is estimated that the Honolulu Harbor handles over 11 million tons of cargo annually.

### CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT (CBD)

Honolulu's Central Business District is the historic, economic and government hub for the Island of Oahu. Many Hawaii-based companies have their headquarters located within this area in addition to being home to the Hawaii State Capitol, Washington Place (governor's mansion), Honolulu Hale (Honolulu's City Hall), and most of the Federal, state and governmental buildings.




### KAKAAKO

Encompassing nine city blocks to the southeast of Honolulu's Central Business District, Kamehameha Schools and the Howard Hughes Corporation is currently developing Kakaako into an urban community that embraces the island lifestyle and Hawaiian culture. Once an industrial and retail district with warehouses and various low-rise retail shops, plans for this mixed-use master planned community includes open-air gathering places, networked walking paths, unique retail experiences and up to 8,000 vertical low- and high-rise residential units to support families of various income levels.



# Stacking Plan




