Planes, Trains and Automobiles

With three nearby ports, an exceptional interstate system, a major rail yard, and a regional airport, Florence County is a prime location for industries to take advantage of quick access to the east coast and beyond.

Florence County is strategically located at the intersection of I-20, which begins in Florence and extends through Dallas, Texas, and I-95, the major North/South thoroughfare on the east coast.

With close proximity to the ports of Charleston, Wilmington, and Dillon, the world is your oyster when you do business in Florence County.

Exactly halfway between Miami and New York, Florence County provides access to more than 30 percent of major US markets with easy access to direct interstate connections with I-26 and I-77.

Whether you're looking to fly high or stay grounded, you (and your cargo) are good to go with daily flights from Florence Regional Airport and CSX's largest rail yard in South Carolina at your fingertips.

LOCATION AND LOGISTICS

Interstates



Florence County is strategically located at the intersection of I-20, which begins in Florence and extends through Dallas, Texas and I-95, the major North/South thoroughfare on the east coast. Exactly half-way between Miami and New York, Florence County provides excellent access to markets and is in close proximity to direct interstate connections with I-26 and I-77.

Florence County's exceptional interstate system allows industries to take advantage of the quick access to the east coast and beyond.

Ports



The robust ports system of South Carolina allows industries to connect to the world. Florence County is a short drive from the Dillon Inland Port. Additionally the Port of Charleston, now the deepest harbor on the East Coast at 52 feet, is approximately a two hour drive from Florence County.

- Dillon Inland Port - approximately 25 miles from Florence
- Port of Charleston - approximately 110 miles from Florence
- Port of Wilmington - approximately 110 miles from Florence
- Port of Savannah - approximately 175 miles from Florence

Rail



CSX established their largest South Carolina rail yard in Florence. This rail yard accommodates CSX's regional headquarters, which comprises a four state region from Richmond, Virginia to Savannah, Georgia. Industries can easily import and export by utilizing CSX rail that runs through Florence County.

Airports



The Florence Regional Airport has provided service to the public for over 75 years. Florence Regional offers daily flights by American Airlines and is heavily used for general aviation. The hub serving Florence Regional Airport is the Charlotte-Douglas International Airport.

We have two runways (Runway 01/19 @ 6,000' and Runway 09/27 @ 6,500') Runway 09/27 is a precision instrument runway with a Category I ILS. The airport maintains full FAA Part 139 certification. The airport also has a full-service Fixed-Base Operation with fueling, aircraft servicing and maintenance services available.

Other airports in close proximity to Florence County:

Columbia Metropolitan Airport - approximately 1 hour from Florence

Myrtle Beach Regional Airport - approximately 1 hour 30 minutes from Florence

Charleston International Airport - approximately 2 hours from Florence

Charlotte Douglas International Airport - approximately 2 hours from Florence

WORKFORCE TRAINING

Francis Marion University



Francis Marion University (FMU) is the Pee Dee region's 4-year university, offering a vast array of 4-year degrees including engineering and business programs to over 4,000 students each year. The FMU Industrial Engineering program is accredited by the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET). Additionally, FMU's School of Business is accredited from the prestigious Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB), the premier accrediting body for business education. Only five percent of business schools worldwide hold this accreditation.

Florence-Darlington Technical College



Florence-Darlington Technical College (FDTC) provides a regional student-centered experience through technical education, workforce development training, and economic development activities. Located on the campus of Florence-Darlington Technical College (FDTC), *Southeastern Institute of Manufacturing and Technology (SiMT)* exists to support industry, education and economic development. The SiMT is a 189,000 SF advanced manufacturing center that provides area and future industries with access to emerging technologies, while advancing the region's ability to provide a highly skilled workforce. The facility boasts a 800-seat auditorium, a configurable conference center that accommodates up to 1200, and various meeting spaces and classrooms. The SiMT's Additive Manufacturing Center (aka 3D printing) features metal and multiple plastic and thermoplastic printing capabilities. The Social Media Listening Center provides consulting and social media monitoring services to large and small businesses. FDTC's Corporate and Workforce Division offers open-enrollment, onsite, and customized training. The Gould Business Incubator at the SiMT provides new small businesses with access to the SiMT and additional resources, in a clean, modern and reasonably priced facility.

The Continuum



The Continuum is a \$25 million, 46,000-square-foot regional education and workforce center and the vision of Lake City philanthropist and entrepreneur Darla Moore. The center is located in Lake City's revitalized downtown and is part of an educational initiative partnership between the Darla Moore Foundation, Francis Marion University and Florence-Darlington Technical College. It provides opportunities for students through training and certifications in workforce development skills, courses that lead to 2- and 4-year degrees, dual credit courses for high school students, and programs for K-12 students in science and innovation.

Coastal Carolina University



Coastal Carolina University (CCU) is located in Conway and offers over 100 undergraduate and graduate degree programs. Like neighboring FMU, CCU's College of Business is accredited by AACSB and College of Science is accredited by ABET. The CCU baseball program made headlines after bringing home the 2016 NCAA National Championship title. With over 10,000 students enrolled each year, academic and athletic excellence abounds at CCU

Apprenticeship Carolina



Apprenticeship Carolina, a division of the South Carolina Technical College System, works to ensure all employers in South Carolina have access to the information and technical assistance they need to create demand-driven registered apprenticeship programs. The program offers consultants at no cost to employers. These consultants guide companies through the registered apprenticeship development process, from initial information to full recognition in the National Registered Apprenticeship System. South Carolina employers who have registered apprentices are awarded an annual \$1,000 state tax credit, over the life of the apprenticeship, and there is no limit to the number of apprentices that an organization may have. In addition, the South Carolina Technical College System has been awarded grants in the past that can support employers in training their apprentices.



Coker University is a four-year liberal arts institution located in Hartsville. Founded in 1908, Coker is a bachelor's and master's degree-granting institution and competes in 21 NCAA Division II sports. Coker is ranked among the "Best Colleges" in the South by U.S. News & World Report as well as The Princeton Review, and by Washington Monthly as No. 2 in South Carolina for value.

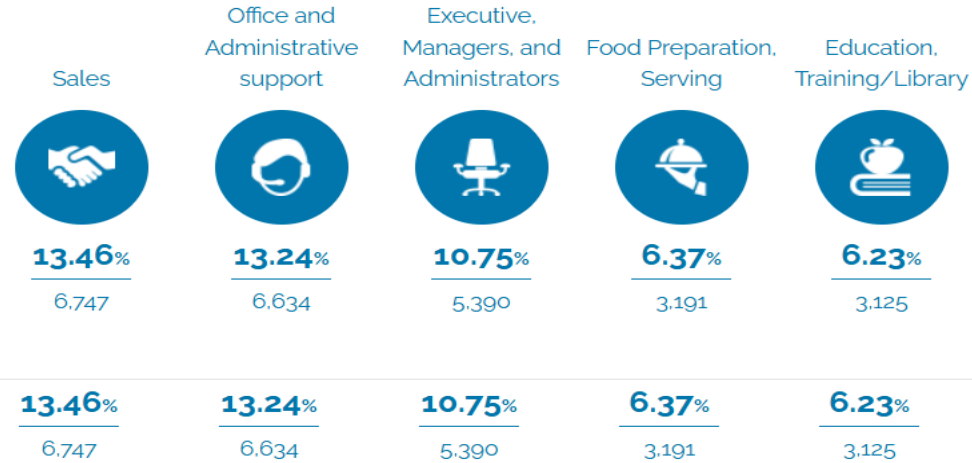

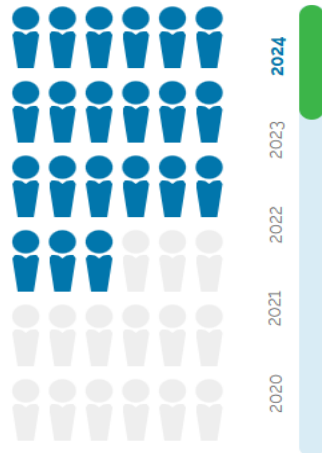

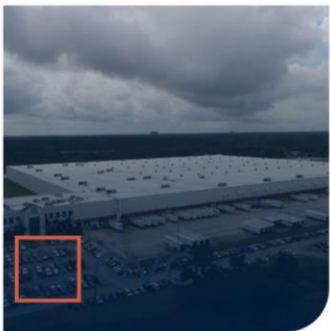
