



THE SEA HAG

(QUITE THE HISTORY)

Throughout the years, this property has gone through several uses. The 200-seat Ilwaco Theatre was opened by 1926. By 1930 it was listed with 320-seats. The 1950 Film Daily Year Book included the Ilwaco Theatre on Main Street with 310 seats.

In 1955, manager Tim Williams was building a new tunnel rear exit to replace the previous exit at the side of the screen so he could add a widescreen to the Ilwaco, which would maintain its 310 seats.

In 1956, J. G. Williams had decided to close the Ilwaco Theatre after having run it for the previous thirty years. Despite his having made improvements to the house, patronage had continued to decline.

After the Ilwaco Theater closed it's doors, it later became the infamous Sea Hag Tavern for many years. Ownership changed hands to it's current owners in 2006. The bar was in operation until about 2017 when owners began some remodeling to increase the space of the building.

In 2021, Ilwaco, WA had a population of 1.73k people with a median age of 38.4 and a median household income of \$70,282. Between 2020 and 2021 the population of Ilwaco, WA grew from 1,431 to 1,725, a 20.5% increase and its median household income grew from \$50,402 to \$70,282, a 39.4% increase.
