









178 N WELLS NEIGHBORHOOD LOCATION



Third Largest City in the United States

As the third largest city in the United States, with a metropolitan area population of approximately 8.8 million people, Chicago is one of the most important financial, industrial, and cultural centers in the nation.

Strong & Stable Economy

With a base of 4.43 million highly skilled employees and a gross regional product (GRP) more than \$569 billion, Chicago's economy is larger than those of most countries across the world, ranking 21st among all global economies. Businesses in Chicago benefit greatly from the sizable and concentrated pool of specialized services and highly educated employees which all serve to promote businesses in Chicago and around the world.

Highly Diversified Business Environment

Rated the #1 Largest U.S. Metro for Economic Diversity by Moody's Investor Services, Chicago is a key participant in every economic sector, from risk management innovation to manufacturing to information technology to health services.

Premier Global City

Chicago is one of the premier global cities in North America. According to A.T. Kearney, The Chicago Council on Global Affairs, and Foreign Policy magazine, the Global Cities Index 2016, which considers business activity, human capital, information exchange, cultural experience, and political engagement, has ranked Chicago seventh in the world. In addition, the city was named the fourth most important business center in the world by the MasterCard Worldwide Centers of Commerce Index.

Highly Skilled Labor Pool

The Chicago area benefits from a highly educated and diverse workforce. Over 41 percent of Chicago's population has received a bachelor's degree or higher, which exceeds the state and national averages of 36 percent and 33 percent, respectively. Additionally, the median age in Chicago is 34 and approximately 60 percent of the population of Chicago is under the age of 40—a key indicator of future economic growth and strength. Further, Chicago has one of the largest science and engineering workforces in the United States.

Airport Accessibility

Chicago's accessibility and growth are largely driven by its excellent transportation network, highlighted by its two international airports. O'Hare International Airport is one of the world's busiest and largest airports and is currently in a \$6.6 billion O'Hare Modernization Program, which is the City of Chicago's vision for creating a 21st century airport facility. Midway International Airport completed an extensive \$800 million expansion and renovation in the last several years.

Port of Chicago Access

The Chicago metropolitan region provides convenient access to the Port of Chicago, the leading intermodal container handler in the Western Hemisphere, with substantially more volume than Los Angeles and more than five times that of New York. It's currently the world's largest intermodal container handler after Hong Kong and Singapore.



Built on Value

Chicago minted a record twelve new unicorns in 2021.

Chicago is emerging as a global capital for unicorns – companies that achieve a \$1 billion valuation. Currently home to twenty-three unicorns, up from eight in 2016, Chicago has out-produced cities such as Berlin and London. Of the aforementioned twenty-three unicorn start-ups, over half reached unicorn status in 2021 alone, a testament to the city's increasing momentum as a unicorn start-up hub. The year 2022 is off to a great start, with the first unicorn announced on February 1st: logistics company Loadsmart.


