Anchored by Optimist Hall to the south and NoDa to the north, restaurants and retailers will enjoy neighborhood co-tenancy.



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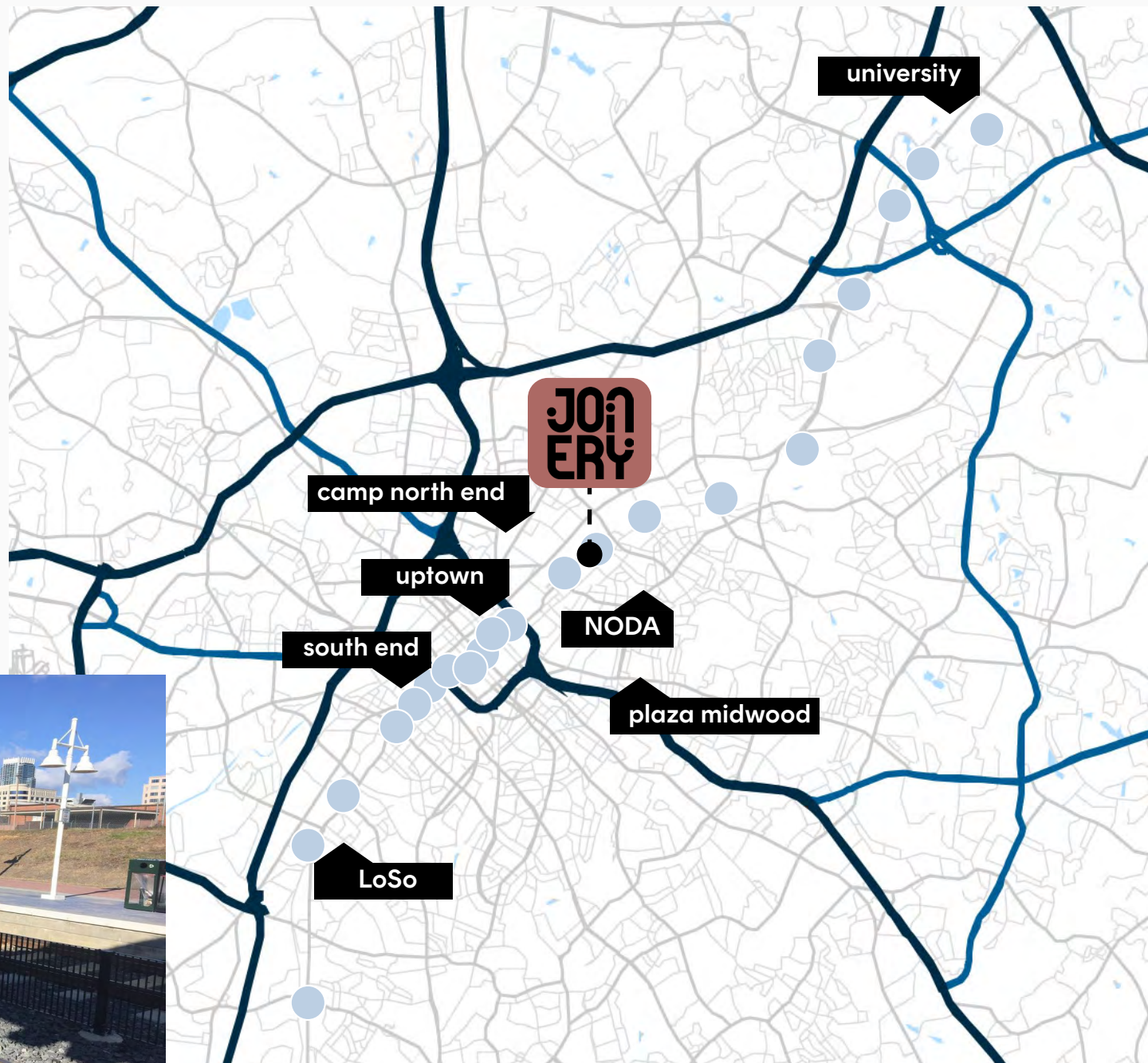


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THE LIGHTRAIL: CONNECTED

The blue line light rail is reworking Charlotte's urban fabric. Fast, efficient, and affordable, the light rail is making it easy for Charlotteans to traverse the urban core without a car. The blue line specifically connects Charlotte's busiest neighborhoods and streets: South End, Uptown, and NoDa. It's easy to imagine folks from LoSo all the way up to UNCC hopping on the light rail to explore the shops and restaurants that will soon define the Joinery.



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THE OPTIMIST PARK/NODA NEIGHBORHOOD

Just a few minutes north of the city center by car or light rail, you'll find Charlotte's arts and entertainment district, NoDa (so named for its main drag, North Davidson Street). Once home to turn-of-the-century textile mills, brightly-colored murals, local art galleries, performance venues, restaurants, coffee shops, bars and breweries await in this hipster haven.

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AN ESTABLISHED COMMUNITY

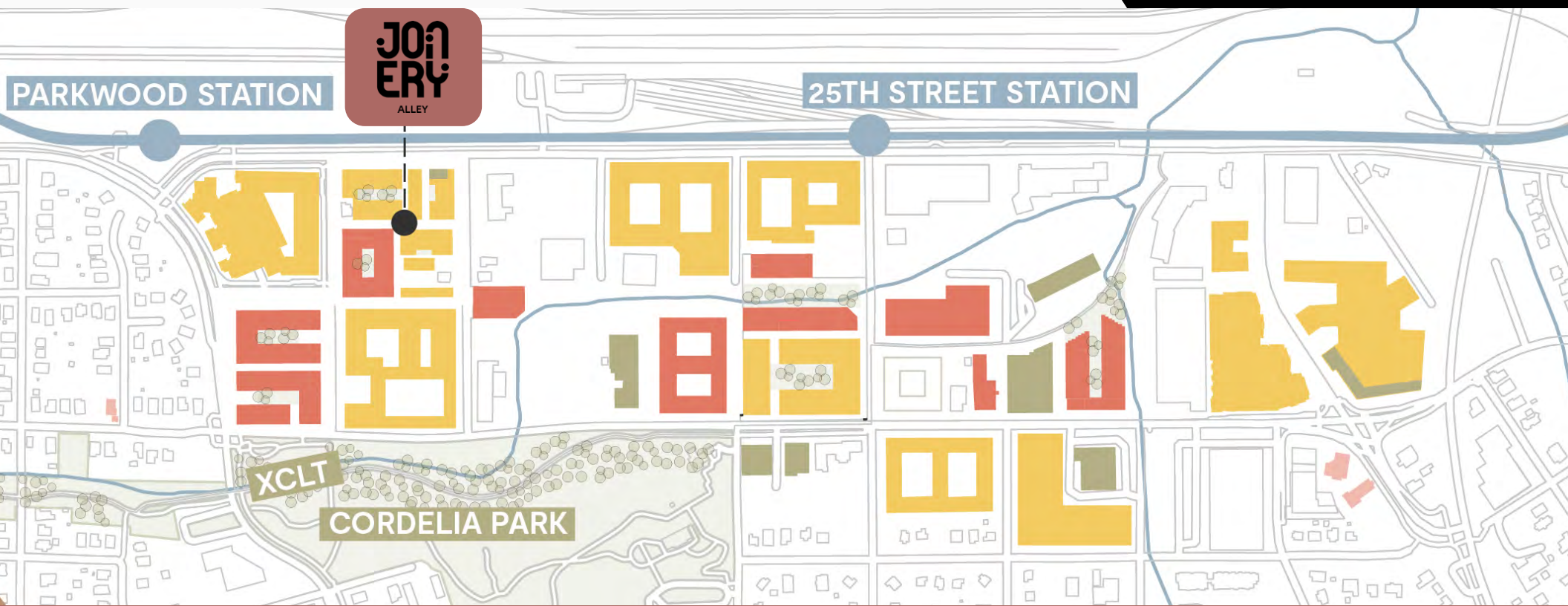
Living in NoDa has plenty of perks. One of the most walkable and colorful neighborhoods in the city, NoDa Charlotte is filled with food, music, art, shopping, and coffee, and most of it is within a five-minute walk. 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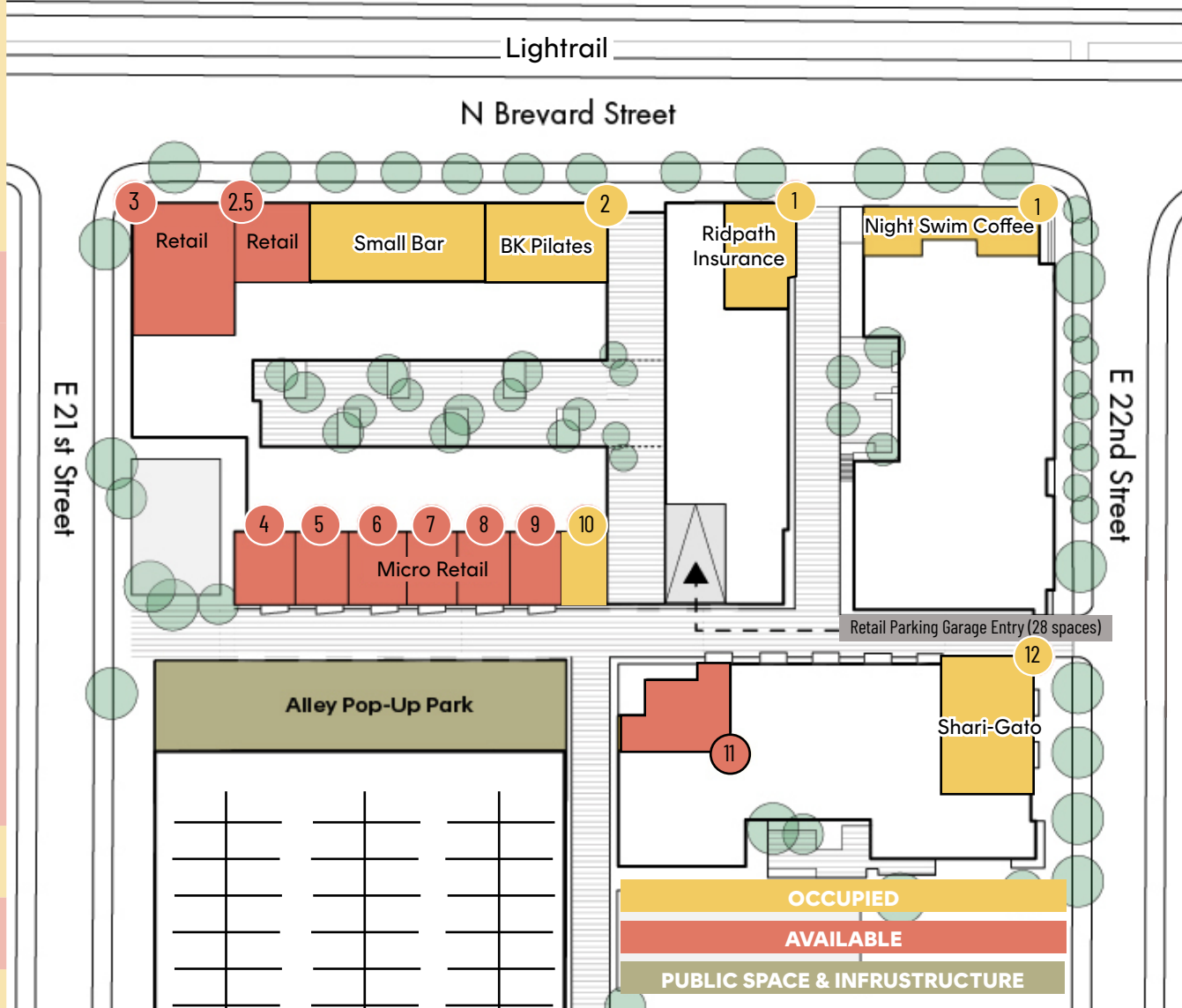

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THE JOINERY ALLEY

NIGHTTIME EATING AND DRINKING ALLEY IN THE HEART OF OPTIMIST PARK.

Joinery Alley is inspired by the alleyways of Tokyo and the winding lanes of London. Live music floats from open storefronts. Crowded restaurants spill onto the sidewalk. Neighbors perch on windowsills and friends wander down the sidewalk with their drinks. The residents who live above hang out on their balconies, taking in the street scene.

Curated collection: assembles fun, elevated restaurants and bars in one buzzing, warmly-lit street.
