


THOMPSON GREEN EXISTING FLOOR PLAN




THOMPSON HOUSE PROPOSED ADDITION






PROPOSED PLAZA ADDITION







Ogunquit, which means "beautiful place by the sea" is a southern coastal town nestled between Wells and York and boasts 3.5 miles of sandy beaches and coastline making it a highly desirable tourist destination with ample restaurants, bars, theaters, art galleries, and shopping.

According to the 2020 United States Census Bureau, the population of Ogunquit is 1,577 and consists of 15.25 square miles, 11.07 square miles of that is water. During the summer months, the population increases to an estimated daily average of 75,000 to 80,000 people.

In the 17th century, Ogunquit was known as Fish Cove and was a shipbuilding and fishing village within the town of Wells. A tidewater basin, called Perkins Cove, was formed when the local fisherman dug a channel across the land to connect Fish Cove with the Josias River. In 1898, artists discovered the area, and the Ogunquit Art Colony was established. The climate ranges from warm to hot and humid summers and cold to severely cold winters.



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
