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Property Overview

Operated for 138 years as St. Mary's in the Mountains and The White Mountain School, this expansive property is rich in history and ready for new owners to bring their vision to fruition. Thoughtfully located in the heart of the White Mountains, complete with rolling hills and magnificent views, the campus consists of over a dozen buildings on 37 acres as well as 75 additional acres of open space with trails and abundant wildlife. As expected for an educational facility, the structures contain dorm rooms, faculty housing, administrative offices, laboratories and classrooms, dining hall and commercial kitchen facilities, a chapel, fine arts studios, fitness facility with 40' climbing wall, maintenance garage, duplexes and headmaster's house. Infrastructure includes town water from Bethlehem and sewer access from Littleton, a 45,000 gallon reservoir, solar arrays, areas of geothermal utilities, paved access roads, parking lots, outdoor amphitheater, walkways, gardens and much more. This is a remarkable opportunity for a new primary or secondary education facility, for an existing institution looking a satellite campus from which to focus on outdoor management, education or conservation, various types of housing or perhaps an all-encompassing residential and retail village providing a thriving community for residents and business alike. Or a multitude of other uses taking advantage of the existing infrastructure and central location to all the White Mountains have to offer.

For 138 years, this extraordinary property operated as St. Mary's in the Mountains and later The White Mountain School, serving as a cornerstone of education and community in the White Mountains of New Hampshire. Today, this historic campus presents a rare opportunity for visionary investors, institutions, or developers to reimagine its next chapter.

Ideally situated amid rolling hills and breathtaking mountain vistas, the property spans 112 acres, including 37 acres of developed campus and 75 acres of pristine forest and open space—complete with scenic trails and abundant wildlife.

The campus includes over a dozen buildings, thoughtfully designed for institutional use:

- *Student dormitories and faculty housing
- *Administrative offices, classrooms, and science labs
- *Dining hall with fully equipped commercial kitchen
- *Chapel, fine arts studios, and performance spaces
- *Fitness facility with a 40-foot climbing wall
- * Maintenance garage, duplex residences, and headmaster's home

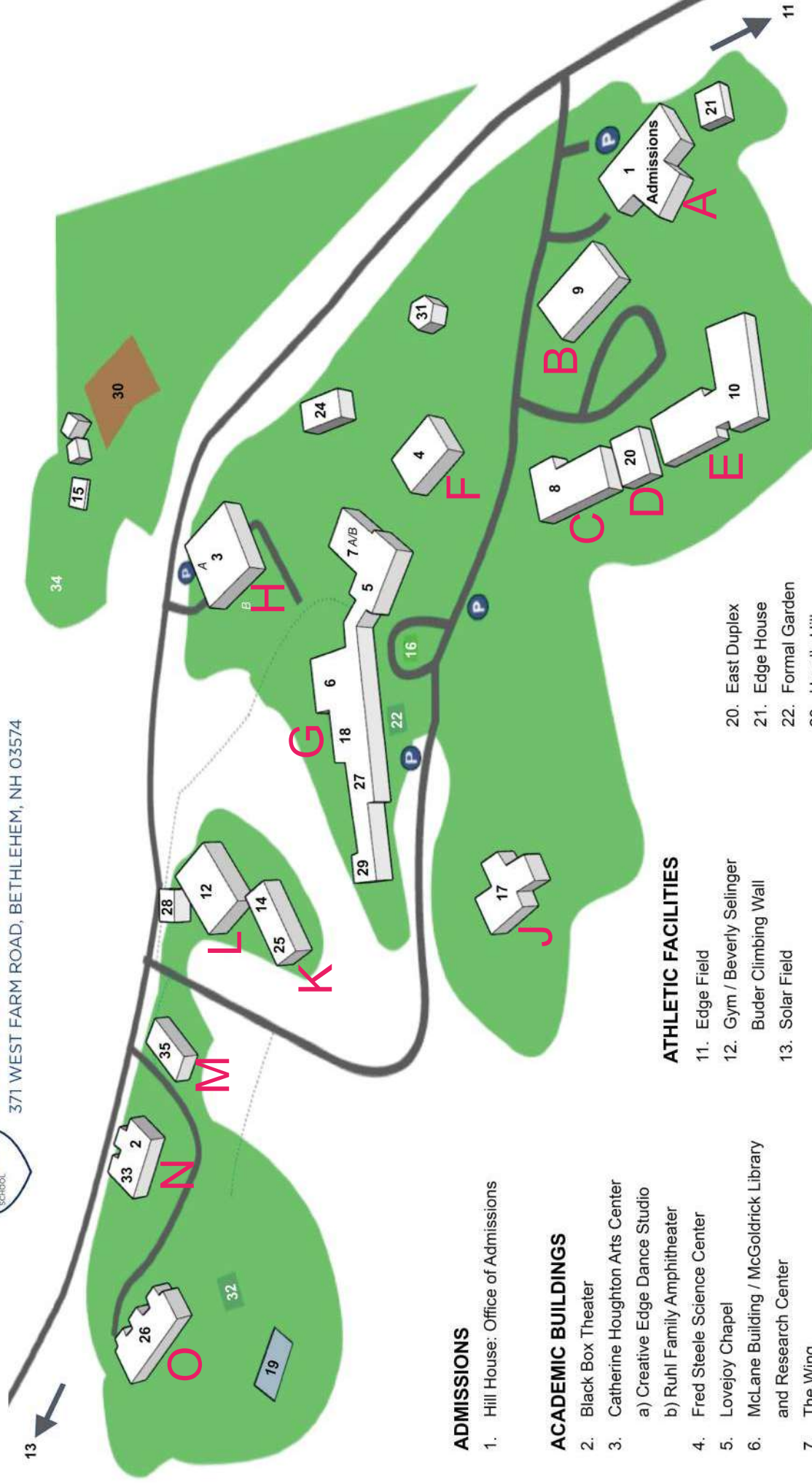

HILL HOUSE

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Building A & 1

This is one of the first campus buildings one sees as you enter the campus and serves as the schools admissions office, student dormitories and faculty housing. It was originally built in 1905 and renovated in 1999-2001+/- . The building is 2.5 floors with the main level used primarily for office use. Some of the original features in the original building still remain, which provides visitors with comforting and welcoming greetings. The main level includes two ½ baths for staff and guests. The second and third floors are used for student and faculty housing. Students share a common bath on each level while faculty apartments include private baths. There are also two separate laundry areas for faculty and students use. This building is equipped with a sprinkler system.

CARTER DORMITORY

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Building B & 9

This structure was built in 1965-1967 +/- and includes student and faculty housing on two floors. The first floor includes 7 student/dorm rooms, a common bath and two faculty apartments, each with its own bath. The second level includes one faculty apartment and 8 dorm rooms as well as a common bath for students. Each level includes a common room for residents to gather to socialize. It is heated with Pellet Fired Hot Water system

BURROUGHS DORMITORY

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Building C - 8

Built in phases between 1965 and 1968 The Burroughs Dorm provides student and faculty housing on two floors. There are 4 faculty apartments each with its own private bath and 12 dorm rooms with a common bath on each floor which include 3 sinks, 3 toilets and 3 showers. The building is equipped with a fire alarm system.

EAST DUPLEX

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Building D & 20

This structure is one of the newer facilities on campus having been built around 2020. This building is used exclusively for faculty housing and includes two 2-story 3-bedroom apartments with a kitchen/dining area, living room, bedroom/den and laundry area on the first level and 2 bedrooms/two baths on the second level. There is also a 2-car garage. The building is equipped with a sprinkler system and security cameras.

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Building E - 10

This, too, is one of the newer buildings on campus having been built around 2019-2020+/- timeframe. Carriage Green is used for faculty and student housing on two floors. The first floor includes 3 faculty apartments each with its own bath, 6 dorm rooms, 2 common baths and a common room. The second floor is a mirror image of the first. An elevator, sprinkler system, laundry area in the basement and security cameras complete the amenities in this newer facility.

FRED STEELE SCIENCE CENTER

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BUILDING F - 4

This 5500+ square foot building was constructed in 2005 has four large classrooms / laboratories, two on each floor, with HVAC system, 450 amp electrical and a small solar array on the roof. There's a full fire suppression system with alarms and sprinklers for laboratory safety. A pair of offices rounds out the well-designed, bright, open and functional space with eco-friendly composting fixtures on the first floor.

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MCLANE BUILDING

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Building G - 5 & 7

Centrally located to all other structures and activities, this building is the heart of the campus and collectively encompasses over 40,000 square feet of facilities, classrooms, offices and living quarters. On this eastern side of “The Link” (a bright and open glass-walled connecting hallway), you’ll find almost 12,000 square feet containing a spacious learning center, the Inquiry, Innovation and Impact Laboratory, and Lovejoy Chapel where students and faculty began their days. There are also smaller rooms that can be used as classrooms, tutoring space or offices.

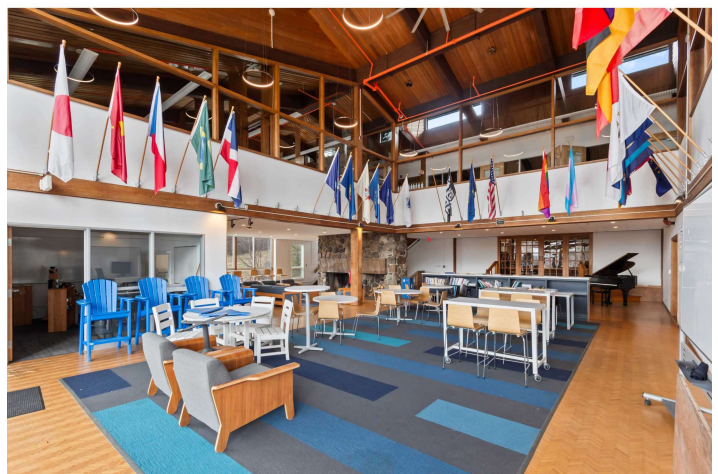
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Building G - 6, 18, 27, 29

Centrally located to all other structures and activities, this building is the heart of the campus and collectively encompasses over 40,000 square feet of facilities, classrooms, offices and living quarters. Here on the western side of The Link, encompassing over 29,000 square feet, you'll find the library and research center, administrative offices, student lounge, and dining hall with full commercial kitchen facilities. There's also a ceramics studio, photography lab, student health services and multiple faculty apartments in The Annex at the extreme western end. A number of tutoring rooms, additional offices and storage and mechanical rooms round out this vibrant and appealing space.

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CATHERINE HOUGHTON ARTS CENTER

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Building H - 3

Constructed in 2013, the 5000+ square foot Arts Center features two large dance studios and lobby on the ground level with music and visual arts studios above. The lower level was previously leased to a local dance company in part thanks to the convenient drop-off loop and paved parking providing easy access for off-campus participants. With the newer construction, this building benefits from geothermal heat, a sprinkler system and leased solar panels on the roof. The outdoor amphitheater behind the building is a wonderful location to relax and enjoy fair-weather performances of the arts.

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DICKEY HOUSE

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Building J & 17

Perhaps one of the more dramatic buildings on the campus, The Dickey House has been used as the residence of the school's Headmaster. Built in the early 70's, it exudes the charming feel of that era. The main level includes an efficient, bright kitchen, large living room with a beautiful stone fireplace which is really the focal point of the main level. A family room, full bath as well as a primary bedroom with full bath completes the first floor. The second floor includes 5 bedrooms and two baths. The first level is heated with FHA while the second does include electric heat. There is an attached 1.5 car garage with a number of garden/patio areas that are accessible to/from the house to enjoy during the warmer months.

FITNESS CENTER, GYM & CLIMBING WALL

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Building L - 12

Located on the west side of campus, this steel-frame building was constructed in the mid-1970's and contains a 40' climbing wall, one of the largest in the area. Surrounding the wall is an indoor track, multi-use basketball court (also utilized for pickleball, volleyball and other "court" sports) and sufficient open space for stationary bikes, treadmills and other fitness and weightlifting equipment. Storage behind the climbing wall is plentiful making it a convenient area to keep both indoor and outdoor equipment while not in use.

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Building M - 35

Built in 2018, this 2164 square foot building consists of two identical apartments, each with 2 bedrooms and 2 baths. These spacious units were built for faculty housing and are located on the outskirts of campus where residents could enjoy an end-of-day reprieve from vibrant campus life while remaining close to the fitness and arts facilities, trails, and all other campus activities. Each unit has a small entry porch and features comfortable and modern living spaces.

Building N - 2, 33

The main use of this 9000 square foot structure is for faculty housing; one unit with 5 bedrooms and 2 baths, a second unit with 3 bedrooms and 1 bath, and a third unit with 2 bedrooms and 1 bath. New boilers (within the last few years) bring heat to the living areas. The east side of the building is known as the Black Box Theater and supports a variety of performance genres in an intimate and traditional setting, with tiered audience seating and space for performer preparation.

Building O - 26

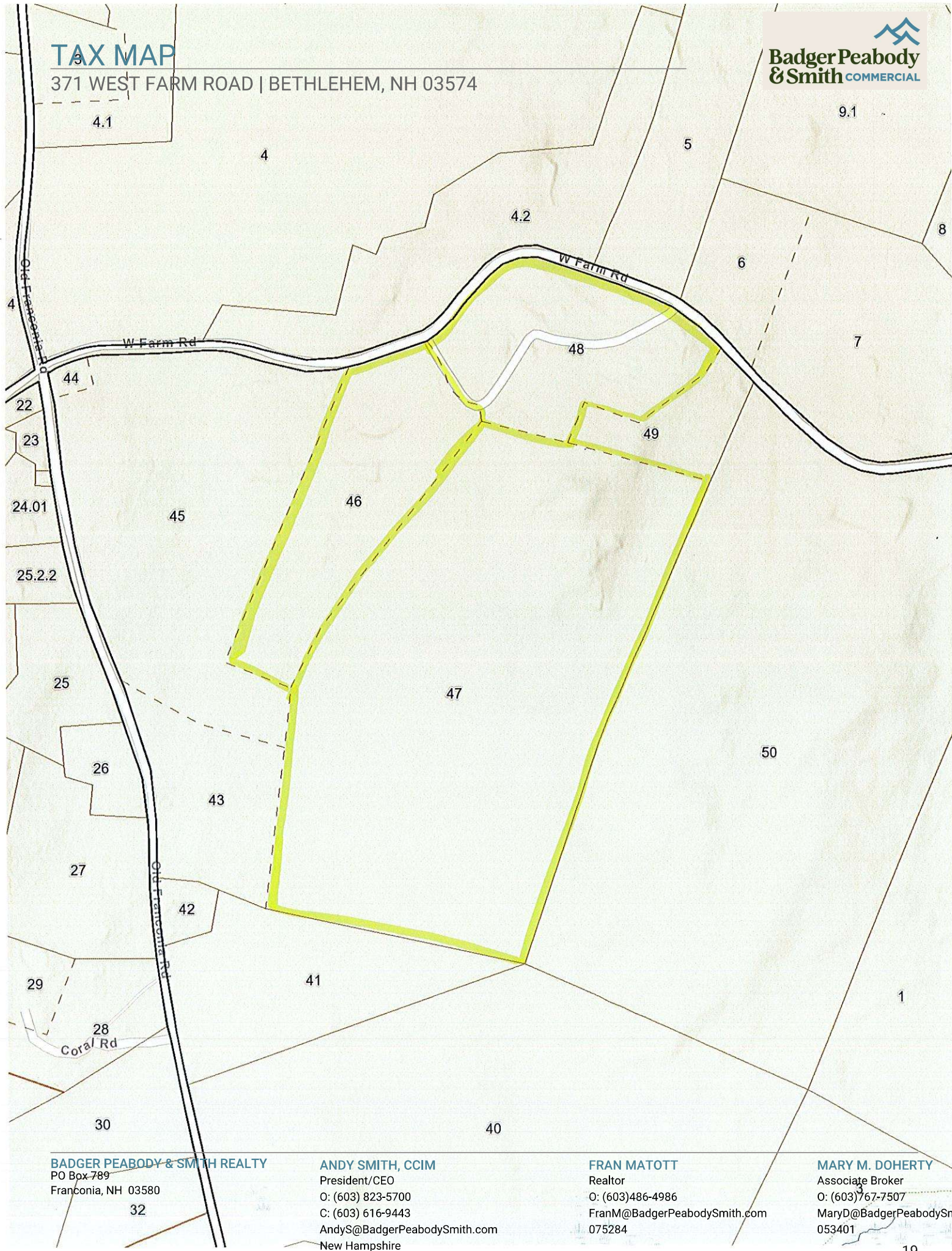
The Solar Dorm was constructed in 1978 providing on-campus housing with over 7000 square feet of space, in a more remote location away from classrooms and other buildings. Originally designed as dorm rooms, the space was renovated into apartments with a common laundry area. Benefiting from southern exposure, a large solarium helped bring the outdoors in and is a comfortable area to engage in hands-on horticulture lessons or relaxing amount the vegetation.

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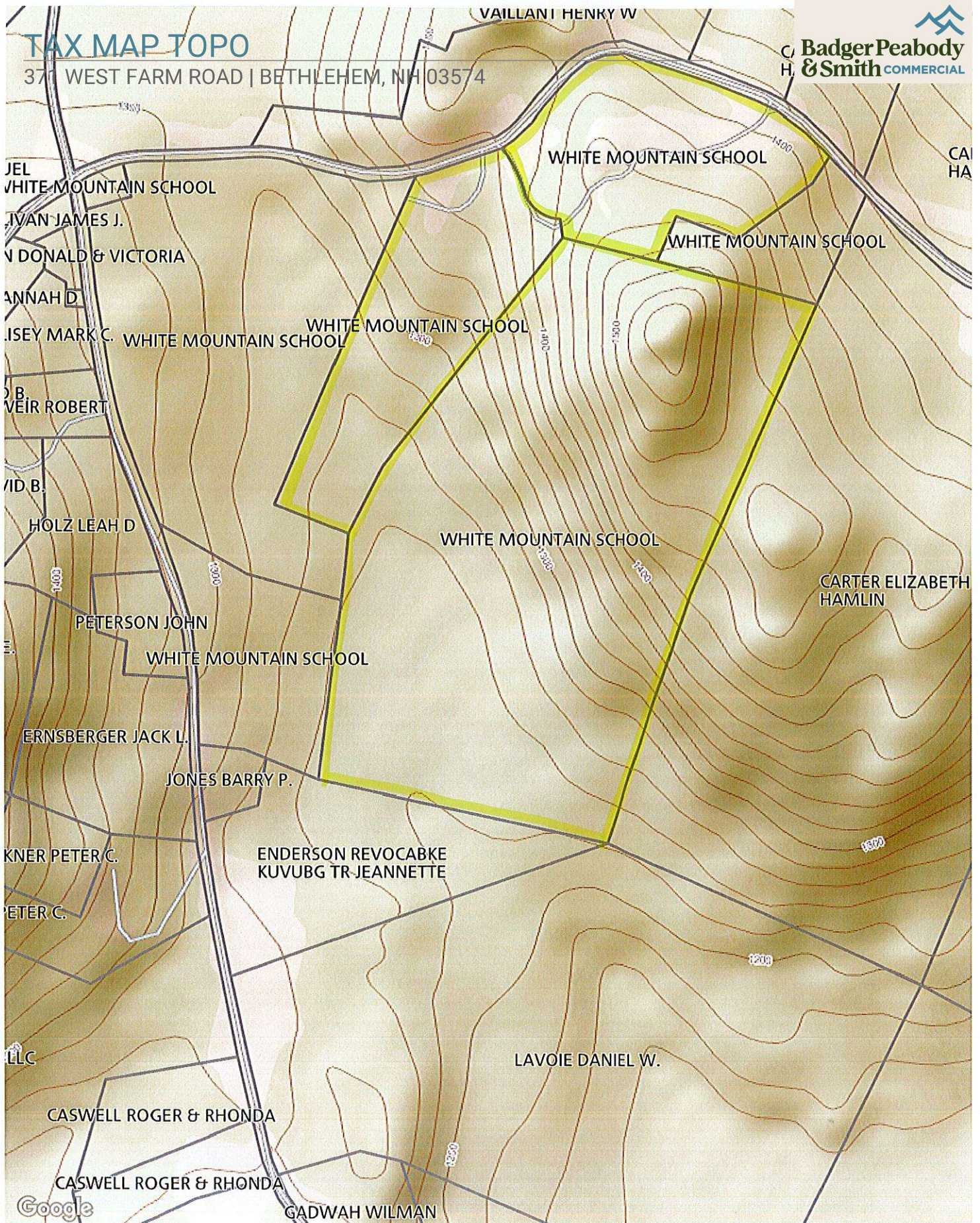
