


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




SITE PLAN

ECONOMY FORT MYERS

The economy of Fort Myers, as of the third quarter of 2023, shows significant activity in the industrial sector, with around 1.4 million square feet of industrial inventory delivered year-to-date, including 251,052 square feet across three buildings during that quarter alone. This demonstrates a robust demand for industrial space in the area.

In terms of employment, the Fort Myers area has experienced a strong economic recovery, especially after Hurricane Ian, with a report of jobs reaching an all-time high. Since the hurricane's landfall, the area has added 2,600 jobs. Over the year, private sector employment in the Fort Myers area grew by 12,700 jobs, which is a 5.4% increase, with the leisure and hospitality industry gaining the most, adding 3,600 jobs.

The unemployment rate showed a significant decrease, from 5.5% in January 2021 to 3.4% in January 2022. Further underlining this positive trend, Lee County's unemployment rate dropped from 4.2% in 2021 to 2.9% in 2022, and there was also a significant addition of commercial space, with builders completing 1.5 million square feet in 2022.

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






AIRPORT TRAFFIC


