- Free studio space provided for emerging artists

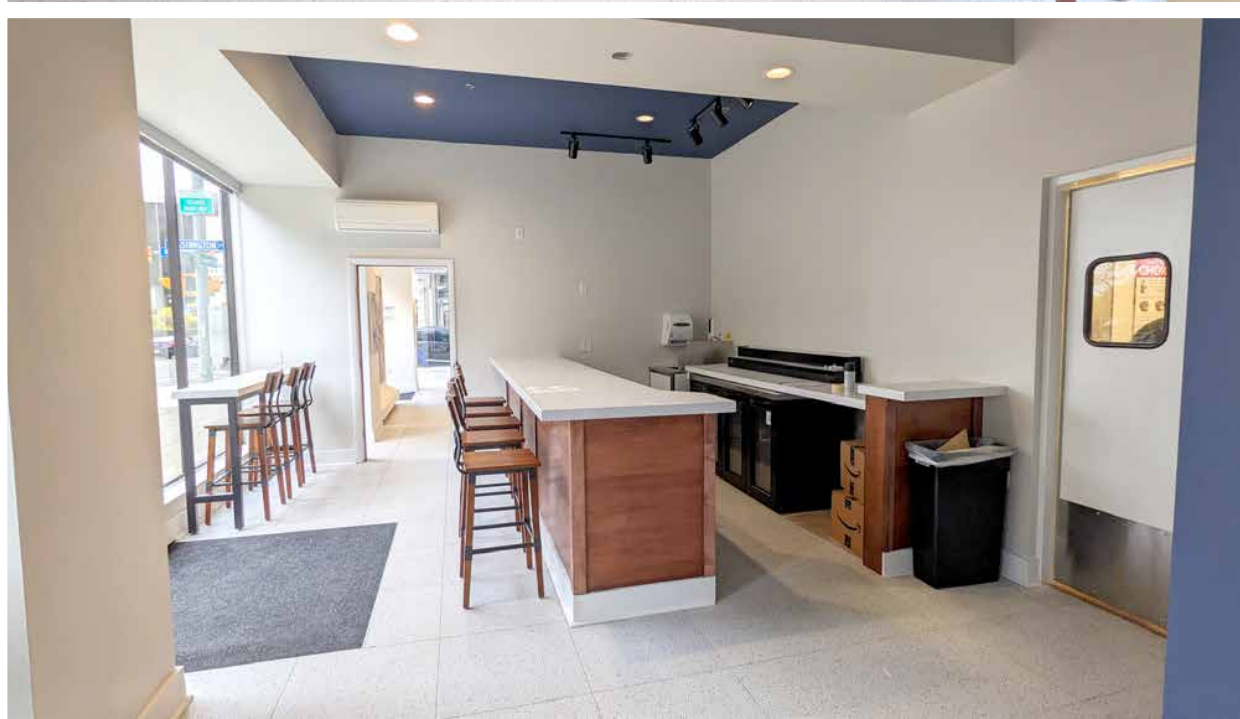


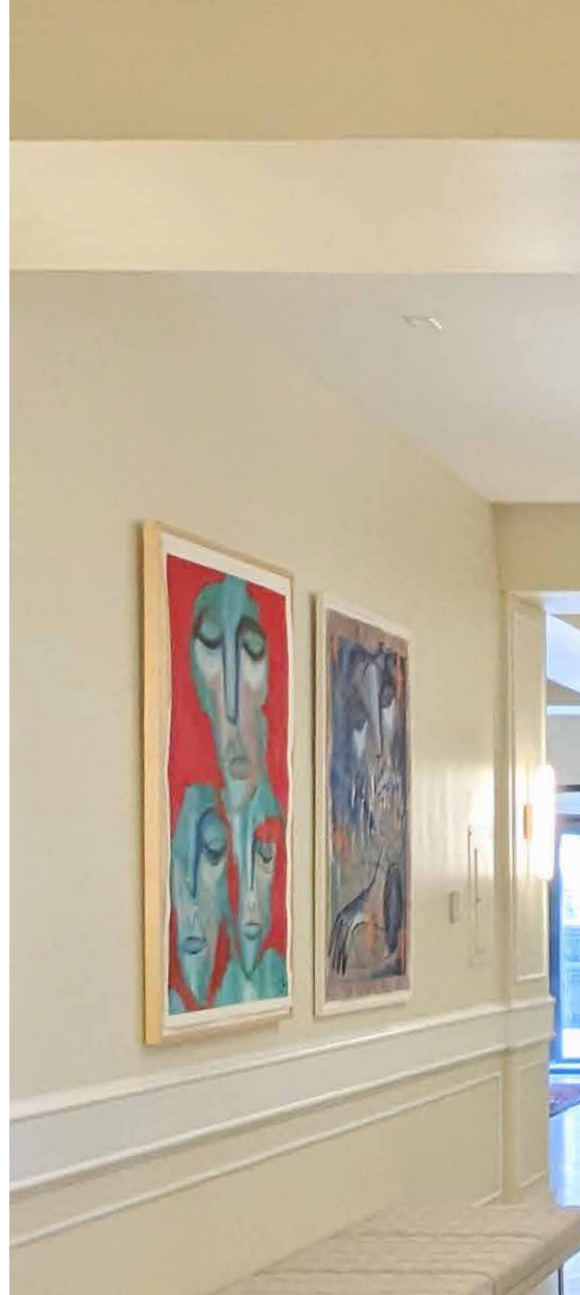

BEEBE'S AT THE GALLERY

- Named after the architect of the Brisbane Building, Milton Beebe
- The design is elegant and complies with the historic designation of the Brisbane Building
- Artwork from the Hunt Art Gallery will abound in this space







BRISBANE LOBBY RESTORATION

- Renovation includes restoration of the 1895 Terrazzo flooring, new bathrooms and lighting
- The lobby will once again open to Lafayette Square and Clinton Street
