130 Marion Street (the "Building") is a free-standing office/retail building located one building east of Tache Avenue along the south side of busy Marion Street. The building which occupies the majority of the 4,826 sf Property site is currently divided into a main floor unit of 3,531 rentable sf with access to the basement of 2,792 rentable sf, and a multi-tenant second floor with independent access and a total of 3,383 rentable sf.

















Floor Plans - 130 Marion

Saint-Boniface: Location Overview


- · Founded in 1818 by Bishop Provencher for the colony's French and Métis residents
- The birthplace of Louis Riel
- Home to one of the largest francophone communities west of the Great Lakes, and is known as Winnipeg's French Quarter
- 10-day winter festival, Festival du Voyageur, which fills the city with snow sculptures and becomes a nightly party (about 75,000 visitors)
- New home for the 4-day event A Taste of Manitoba: 26 restaurants and breweries, 20 vendors, over 12.000 visitors
- During the summer, Jeudi Franco Thursdays brings over 20,000 visitors in St-B, "the place to be"!
- Pedestrians can stroll along and stop in at boutiques, quaint cafés and abundant restaurants
- Visitors can enjoy walking tours and view more than 35 historical sites in this area
- Cathédrale de Saint-Boniface attracts thousands of visitors each year one of city's major architectural landmarks
- District also includes St. Boniface Hospital, Université de Saint-Boniface and Fort Gibraltar,
 The Provincial House of the Grey Nuns and the Canadian Mint
- Home to three golf courses and an abundance of parks
- 6 elementary schools, 2 high schools and 1 private school
- At the end of Marion Street, one of Winnipeg's largest real estate projects is underway: the Tower District, which will bring over 2,000 new residential units to the neighborhood
- Just a few blocks away, the Hospital of Saint-Boniface ranks as the fifth-largest employer in Manitoba, highlighting the area's strong employment base
