



DAVIE, FLORIDA

The Florida town of Davie is located in Broward County, Florida, only 9 miles southwest of Fort Lauderdale and about 25 miles north of Miami. Bordered by the Florida Everglades to the west, Davie is ideally located among major thoroughfares such as Interstates I-595, I-75 and I-95, and is minutes away from Ft. Lauderdale/Hollywood International Airport. The Town of Davie had a population of 107,089 as of July 1, 2023. Horseback riding is common, as much of its historic buildings include ranches and other Western establishments. Named after developer Randolph P. Davie, the town was originally carved out of Everglades land.

Davie's business climate ranges from your typical small proprietor to the headquarters of Fortune 500 firms such as Teva Pharmaceuticals. The largest industries in Davie, FL are Retail Trade (7,498 people), Health Care & Social Assistance (6,576 people), and Educational Services (4,842 people), and the highest paying industries are Utilities (\$79,031), Public Administration (\$78,789), and Finance & Insurance (\$69,829).

Davie is home to campuses of a large number of educational institutions, including the Central Campus of Broward Community College and the Davie Campus of the University of Florida. Davie is also home to Nova Southeastern University. Movie fans may recognize Davie as the home of Rolling Hills Golf Course, the filming locale of the classic hit "Caddyshack."

Davie is home to Flamingo Gardens, a 60-acre site showcasing rare, exotic and native plants. The town is also home to the Young At Art Children's Museum, a hands-on cultural and educational arts venue where kids can express their creativity in a fun and exciting environment. Also in town is the Bergeron Rodeo Grounds. Located in the historical western-themed district of downtown Davie, this attraction has long served as Davie's main tourist draw. The indoor/outdoor facility was originally established as a rodeo arena, but later expanded to meet the demand for more diverse events such as top name concert entertainers, circuses, monster trucks, horse shows, dog shows, car shows, air boat shows and industrial shows.

The Town of Davie is also the nexus of higher education in South Florida where several nationally known colleges, technical institutes, and universities make up the South Florida Educational Center.





FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA

Fort Lauderdale, Florida, is a city located on the coast in southeast Florida and half an hour north of Miami. It is part of the South Florida metropolitan area. Fort Lauderdale is known as the "Venice of America" because of its extensive canal system. The City of Fort Lauderdale is the 10th largest city in Florida with a population of 190,927 as of July 1, 2023.

Fort Lauderdale is home to several Fortune 1000 company headquarters. Several more Fortune 1000 company headquarters are located in nearby Miami. Fort Lauderdale is a part of the diverse economy of Broward County. Service industries dominate the local employment environment. Primary sectors of the services within the City are marine-related industries, tourism, retail and wholesale trade. The city is a major yachting center, with numerous resident yachts and over 100 marinas and boatyards. The tourist industry is a mainstay to the Fort Lauderdale economy, and its hospitality institutions are abundant.

Fort Lauderdale has cultural attractions including the following museums: The IGFA Fishing Hall of Fame and Museum in nearby Danea Beach, The Fort Lauderdale Antique Car Museum, The International Swimming Hall of Fame Museum and Aquatic Complex, The Museum of Art, The Museum of Discovery and Science/Blockbuster IMAX Theater, The Old Fort Lauderdale Village and Museum, For patrons of the performing arts, Fort Lauderdale offers the following: The Bailey Concert Hall in nearby Davie, The Broward Center for the Performing Arts.

With such a warm climate, Fort Lauderdale is home to many outdoor activities. It is a yachting and fishing resort and has long been a favorite spot for college students during spring break. Fort Lauderdale is also home to the world-famous Fort Lauderdale Beach which offers many opportunities for recreation and relaxation.

Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport, near Dania Beach, Florida, is the city's main airport and is the fastest-growing major airport in the country.








