1. LACMA

Located on the Pacific Rim LACMA is the largest art museum in the western United States, with a collection of nearly 149,000 objects that illuminate 6,000 years of artistic expression across the globe. 3. THE LA BREA TAR PITS

Plants and animals from the last 50,000 years are discovered here every day. Outside, you can watch excavators carve foss Is out of the asphalt. Inside the museum at La Brea Tar Pits (established in 1977 as the George C. Page Museum), staff prepare these discoveries in the see-through Fossil Lab. You'll see the final result in our exhibitions: extraordinary saber-toothed cats, mammoths, dire wolves, and mastodons.

Founded as a museum in 1973, Craft Contemporary reveals the potential of craft to educate, captivate, provoke, and empower.
