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


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PROPERTY **Overview**

Merchants Square is an open-air mixed-use lifestyle center anchoring historic downtown Williamsburg, Virginia and its surroundings. Clustered along iconic brick-paved, pedestrian-only Duke of Gloucester Street, is a genuinely national, iconic shopping, dining, and work destination. Nestled between historic Colonial Williamsburg and William and Mary, an elite national university, Merchant's Square is vibrant, beautiful, and bustling. Its historic buildings, tree-lined spaces, and abundant outdoor cafes evoke elegant foreign capitals. The finest restaurants, luxury clothiers, purveyors of fine gifts, a winery tasting room, theater, historic boutique offices, and the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation itself, all call Merchant's Square home.


The available commercial space offers up to 5,000 square feet of retail and approximately 10,000 square feet of office space in various configurations. With an impressive 2.1 million visits in the past year and an average dwell time of 71 minutes, it provides a dynamic environment for businesses. Accessibility is optimized with 1,244 visitor parking spaces within walking distance, spread across six surface lots and two city parking decks, along with ample street parking. This strategically positioned space caters to businesses seeking a professional and accessible setting.






COLONIAL WILLIAMSBURG VISITOR CENTER







WILLIAMSBURG Trade Area





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THE WILLIAMSBURG Market

Founded in 1632, Williamsburg was the first – and for a long time, the only – municipality in Virginia, making it the political, educational, and social center of the largest and wealthiest of the 13 colonies. In 1699, Williamsburg succeeded Jamestown, the first permanent English-speaking settlement in the New World, as Virginia's Colonial Capital.

As of January 2021, the Williamsburg area (City of Williamsburg, James City County, and York County) civilian labor force was 75,653 and the area unemployment rate was 6.45%. Due to Williamsburg's close proximity to major metropolitan areas in Hampton Roads and Richmond, a workforce of 1.3 million are within commuting distance of the City, and residents share a wide variety of occupational and career choices.

In the City of Williamsburg, over 93% of the population 18 years and older hold a high school diploma or GED. Moreover, of individuals 25 to 64, over 50% have a bachelor's degree or higher which compares with 33.7% in the nation.

The City of Williamsburg's economy is largely supported by tourism and education, with two world-class institutions, William & Mary and the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, at the core. The majority of the 700 business establishments within the City either fall into the retail trade or accommodation and food services category, which cater to the 6-8 million annual area visitors.

The Virginia Tourism Corporation reports \$30.3 billion in direct visitor spending in the state for 2022. Locality reports for 2022 will be available in September of 2023. The major tourist attraction Colonial Williamsburg sold 533,700 tickets in 2019. In the fall of 2022, the renowned William & Mary enrolled approximately 9,517 students who provide creativity, energy, and intelligence to this vibrant City.
