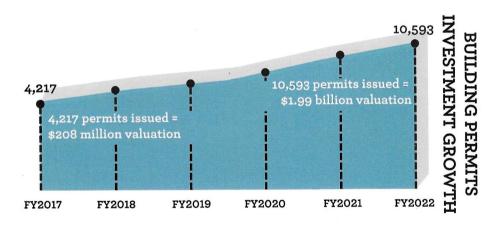

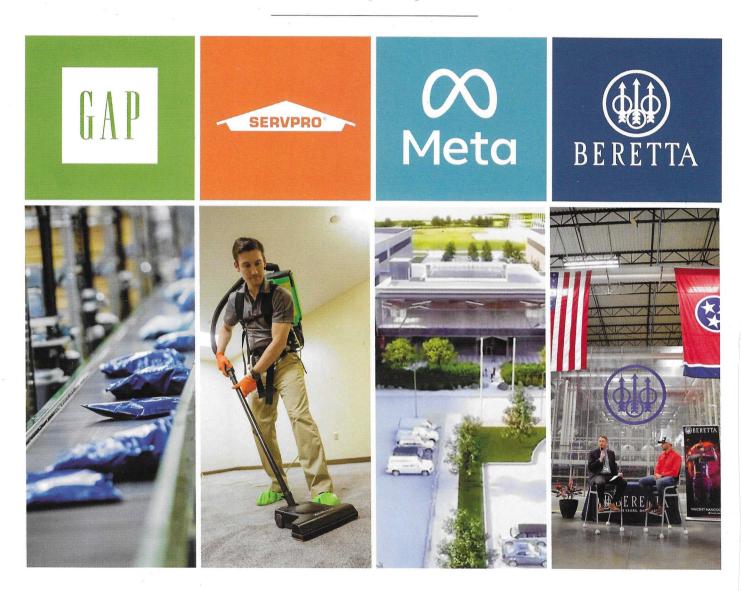

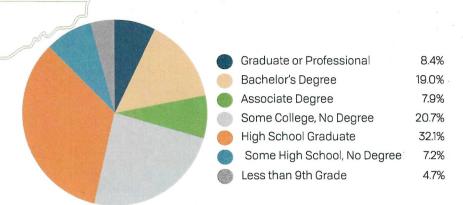

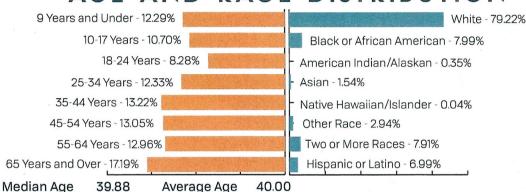

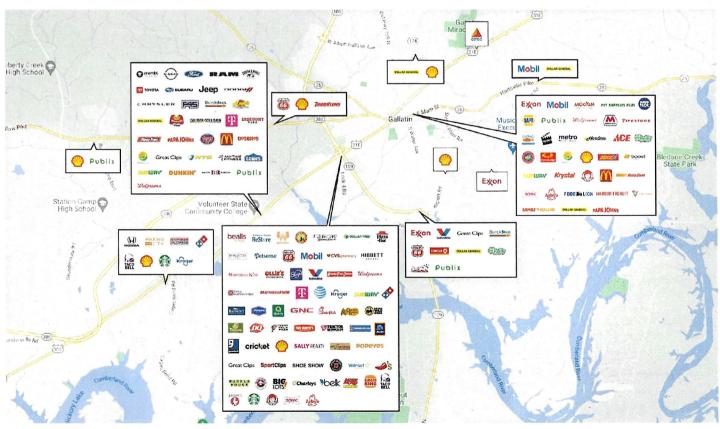




PRIMARY RETAIL TRADE AREA
