




1ST FLOOR




CELLAR FLOOR



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THE VICINITY



Adam Clayton Powell Jr. Boulevard is one of Harlem's most iconic streets, running through the heart of the neighborhood in Manhattan. It's named after the influential politician and civil rights leader Adam Clayton Powell Jr. It runs north-south through the heart of Harlem, starting from 110th Street near Central Park and stretching up to 155th Street, at the border of Washington Heights. The boulevard is a vibrant part of Harlem, lined with a mix of residential buildings, small businesses, and cultural landmarks. The architecture along the street includes classic Harlem brownstones and more modern developments, reflecting the neighborhood's ongoing evolution.
