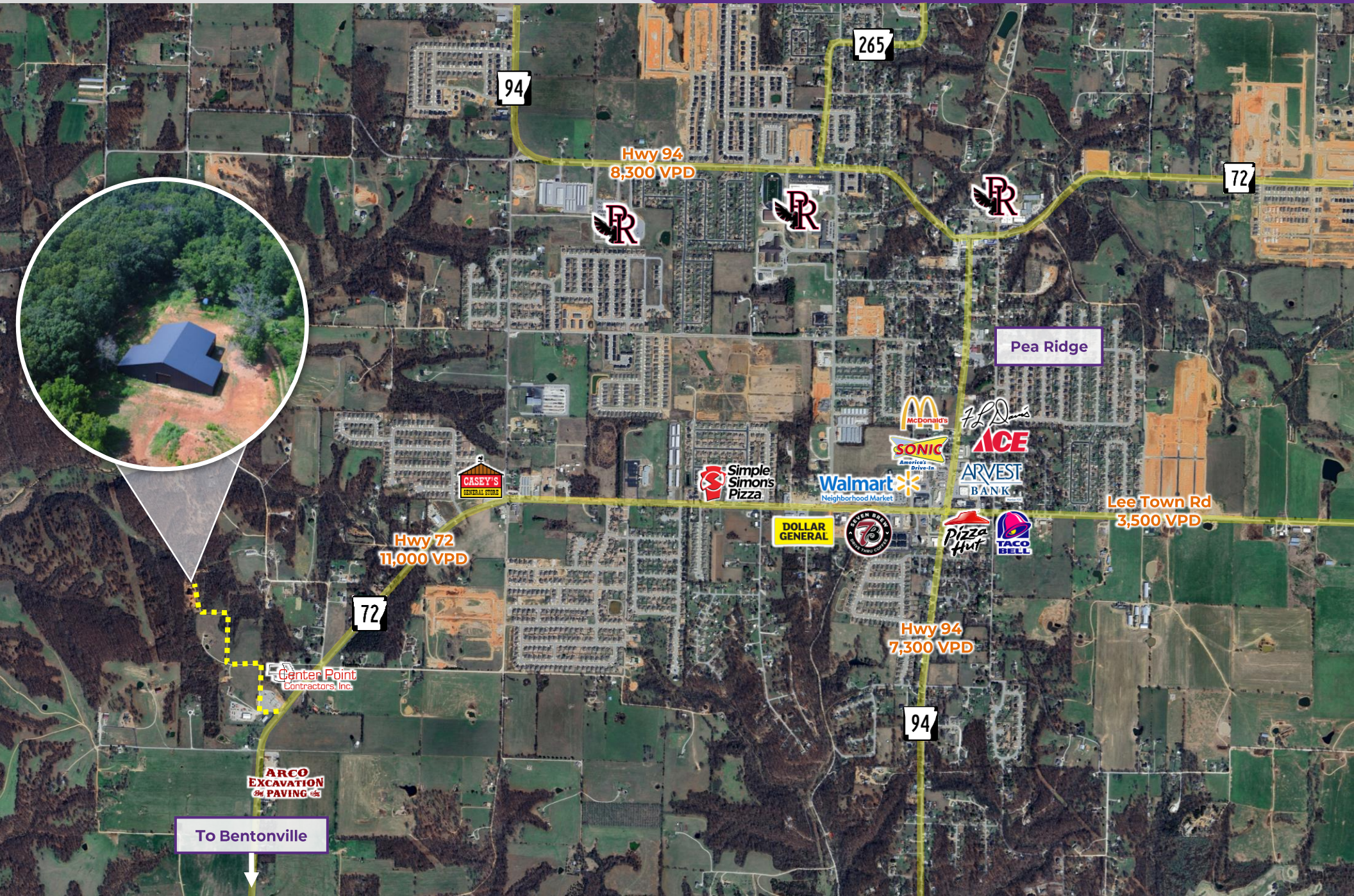

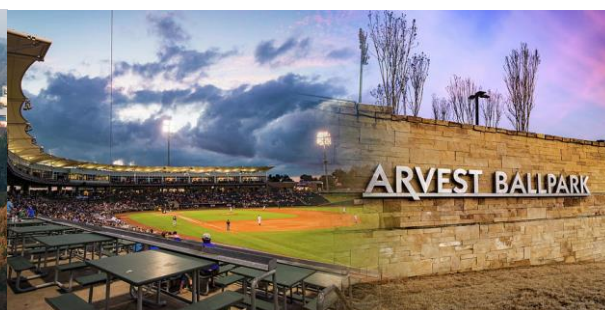

U.S. News & World Report put Northwest Arkansas at #10 on its ranking of the 150 Best Places to Live in the U.S. in 2023.



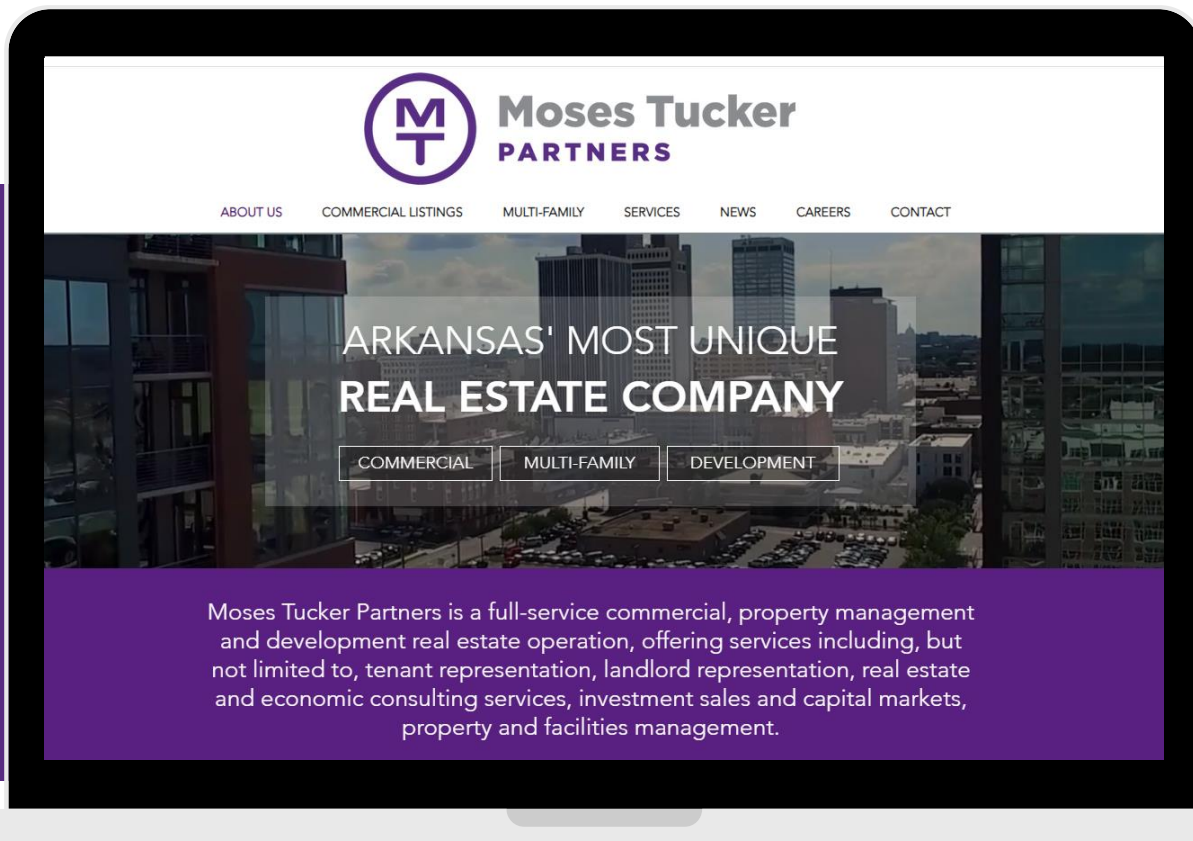
