





Pittsburgh: Quick Stats




An Emerging Tech Hub

Pockets of Pittsburgh now resemble a small-scale Silicon Valley with fast-growing tech businesses that have attracted billions of dollars in private financing and talented young professionals.

Much of the new activity springs directly from the artificial intelligence and machine learning technologies pioneered at Carnegie Mellon University and the University of Pittsburgh, premiere academic institutions that have helped transition the city from industrial giant to technology titan.


Education System

Pittsburgh is home to several prestigious universities, including the University of Pittsburgh, Carnegie Mellon University, and Duquesne University. These academic institutions are leading centers of research and innovation, consistently attracting top talent from around the world. The education industry in Pittsburgh is a significant contributor to the regional economy, with over 60,000 students enrolled in area colleges and universities.



Life Sciences

In a world where health and safety are considered increasingly paramount, the region's advancements in biotech, therapeutics, pharmaceuticals, and medical devices attract both global talent and billions in research and development investments.

Pittsburgh recorded 6,800 life sciences jobs in 2018, with the average wage in the industry starting at \$80,913. Between 2008-2018, 237 company expansions occurred, 22,378 industry jobs were created, and \$4 billion in capital investment was secured.





McKees Rocks

A small Allegheny County borough situated just outside Pittsburgh, McKees Rocks is home to a diverse community of roughly 6,000 residents, offering a small-town feel as an alternative to city living.

The housing market features an affordable mix of older homes and new developments, attractive to first-time homebuyers and local renters. Several small businesses add to the area's charm, providing residents with dining, retail, and entertainment options.

The borough is well-connected to the rest of the region, with near immediate access to major highways, including I-79 and I-376.

Downtown Pittsburgh is just a 15-minute commute, making McKees Rocks a convenient option for residents that enjoy a smaller community while still having access to the city's cultural amenities and job opportunities.



Living in McKees Rocks

With an emerging arts and entertainment scene, business district revitalization, industrial development on riverfront property and appealing proximity to downtown Pittsburgh, McKees Rocks is an up-and-coming neighborhood bursting with energy. As strategic projects and initiatives transform the area, McKees Rocks and Stowe Township (Sto-Rox) are becoming increasingly attractive choices for prospective residents.

Known for its host of art and music venues, McKees Rocks is a popular entertainment destination: The Parkway Theater, Rocks Landing, The Roxian Theater, and Father Ryan Arts Center are just a few of the established businesses fueling the area's thriving artistic community.

Residents of McKees Rocks have excellent access to recreational opportunities, living in close proximity to Sheraden and Fairhaven Park: both green spaces offer locals numerous acitivities and amenities including sports fields, athletic courts, swimming pools, playgrounds, and walking trails. The adjacent Ohio River and Chartiers Creek also provide boating, fishing, and kayaking opportunities.

Black Forge Coffee

A metal-themed cafe, roastery, and music venue with plans to expand the 6,000 SF building to include a coworking and art gallery space.

Roxian Theatre

Formerly a classic movie house theatre, the Roxian is a now Live Nation venue hosting concerts, social gatherings, corporate events, and weddings, in a newly renovated space.

Sheraden Park

A forested park with playgrounds, walking trails, sports fields, a skate park, and swimming pool that is undergoing significant development planning for added improvements.

Mancini's Bakery


