

## Shenville Creamery

The Creamery is located in one of the most touristic and agricultural areas, which is Shenandoah County and Rockingham County. Situated between two large and popular cities, Winchester in the North and Harrisonburg in the South, and in a historical area where the civil war ended. It is surrounded by 6 big towns and close to one of the largest universities, JMU.

## Highlights

- Land containing total 176 acres in total, Agriculture A1; General industrial M1
- Two large commercial buildings for dairy and other food processing, each building is 7500 sq ft.
- Two Rental houses. (One house overlooking the Shenandoah River)
- Shenandoah River runs through the land.
- Farmland for Corn, Wheat, Asparagus, Strawberries, Green beans, Tomatoes, Pumpkins etc. Currently we are only growing corn and wheat which gives a profit of \$50,000-\$100,000 each per year.
- Barns/Shed facilities for animals (We also hold a USDA license in a domestic market for Chicken and beef)
- Contain 2 private wells
- Contains 1 commercial well with special deed, the capacity to pump 1000 gallon per minute (spring water)
- Special Irrigation System for Crop Land
- Hemp License for the state on Virginia for growing and processing.

The region is home to the Harrisonburg and Staunton-Waynesboro Metropolitan Statistical Areas, seven counties (Augusta, Bath, Highland, Page, Rockbridge, Rockingham, and Shenandoah) and five independent cities (Buena Vista, Harrisonburg, Lexington, Staunton, and Waynesboro).

The central Shenandoah Valley is 153 miles southwest of Washington, D.C. and 7 08 miles northwest of Richmond, the state capital.





The Shenandoah Valley offers a readily trainable workforce and a powerful cluster of employers rooted in manufacturing, agriculture, and logistics. Home to successful long-standing companies, contagious entrepreneurial spirit, and complete workforce solutions, the Shenandoah Valley was rated by Colliers International as one of the "10 Emerging U.S. Industrial Markets to Watch in 2019." Four out of five of Virginia's top agricultureproducing counties are located here, making the Shenandoah Valley the number one region in the Commonwealth for the total value of agricultural products sold. Food and beverage production is at the heart of the region's manufacturing sector, employing over 16% of the Valley's labor force, more than four times that of the national average.
