






Today's featured images highlight the recreational history of the Chattahoochee and its connection to Lake Eufaula.

- 1) The Holiday Inn gave Eufaula visitors a comfortable room with a view when it opened in 1962. Sitting high atop the bluff, the Holiday Inn overlooked the newly forming Lake Eufaula/Walter F. George. The motel is now closed. (Courtesy of Rob Schaffeld.)
- 2) Built in 1952 by Robert Hornsby, the Chewalla Motel was Eufaula's first motel. This card advertised "air-conditioned... steam heat." There were 114 units. (Courtesy of Rob Schaffeld.)
- 3) The Chewalla Motel is located directly on Chewalla Creek on Lake Eufaula. After the Chattahoochee River was impounded in the early 1960s, boat travel and recreation breathed new life into Eufaula. (Courtesy of Rob Schaffeld.)
- 4) As Eufaula grew, so did the Chewalla Motel. More units were added, and a restaurant opened next door. Known today as the Lakeside Motor Lodge, the motel still welcomes guests to Lake Eufaula/Walter F. George. (Courtesy of Rob Schaffeld.)
- 5) The Lake Eufaula Summer Spectacular featured American Power Boat Association (APBA) sanctioned, outboard performance-class, closed-course, national championship boat races. Often called the Daytona 500 of powerboat racing, this event attracted approximately 200 competitors racing before more than 25,000 spectators. The boat races were held throughout the 1970s and into the early 1980s. (Courtesy of Doug Purcell.)
