





WHY UTAH?



Utah continuously ranks at the top among the states, both economically and for its population growth and youthful demographics. Currently ranked #2 for lowest unemployment rate (2.1% vs U.S. 3.9%) and Utah continues to be at the top of these charts.

Utah was named the Most Diverse Economy in the Nation by the Hachman Index and ranked the #1 market for economic outlook by ALEC in 2021 for the 14th year in a row. On the population front, Utah was the fastest growing state the last decade and grew 1.8% from 2020 to 2021 compared to the U.S. population growth of 0.1%. Additionally, Utah has the youngest population in the nation with a median age of 31 versus the U.S. median age of 38. It's easy to see why Utah's population is soaring with a strong economy and a young, well-educated population.


