

Pascagoula is a major industrial city located along the Gulf of Mexico in Jackson County, MS. Pascagoula is currently home to 22,000 residents and is the county seat of Jackson County, which boasts a population of 141,425. Pascagoula is conveniently located thirty minutes west of Mobile, and two hours east of New Orleans. Pascagoula offers small town charm, world class recreation, and abundant economic opportunities within an easy drive of major metropolitan communities.

Pascagoula is home to the state's largest employer, Ingalls Shipbuilding, which is a leading producer of ships for the United States Navy, and the largest private employer in Mississippi with 12,100 employees on site. Other major industries include one of the largest Chevron refineries in the country; Signal International, an oil platform builder; and Mississippi Phosphates. Other Major Area Employers include Chevron Refinery (3,600 employees), Singing River Health System (2,300 employees), and VT Halter Marine (1,700 employees).


The Pascagoula-Gautier District (PGSD), located in the southeast corner of Mississippi and between the cities of Gulfport / Biloxi, MS and Mobile, AL, is a public school district that houses approximately 7,000 students in 19 elementary (K-4), academy (5-6), middle school (7-8), high school (9 - 12), and specialty school campuses that serve Pascagoula, MS. The PGSD, has a current school budget of \$78 million and employs over 1,100 teachers, administrators, instructional and other support personnel.
