





Savannah Fundamentals

Strategic Distribution Hub

- Multimodal hub fueled by proximity to the Port of Savannah, regional interstate system linking the area to Atlanta and Florida, and Class I rail service from both Norfolk Southern and CSX
- Located on the I-95 corridor with direct access to the Florida markets, Eastern seaboard and Atlanta population center via I-16
- Largest concentration of break bulk import distribution centers on the East coast
- Home to Fort Stewart, the largest US Army installation east of the Mississippi, which also provides a highly trained labor base as soldiers exit the military and join the civilian labor force



Port of Savannah

- The third largest container volume and fastest-growing container port by TEU's in the U.S, providing overnight service to the entire Southeast
- The nation's second busiest Ro/Ro hub handling 876,000 units of auto & high/ heavy machinery in 2024
- Direct connectivity over 80% of the U.S. within 2 days
- The Port's Garden City Terminal is the largest single container terminal in North America. Averaging 14,000 truck moves each weekday - 7,000 trucks in, 7,000 trucks out
- The Brampton Road Connector will provide a direct link between Garden City Terminal's gates and the interstate system. It includes a four-lane highway and state route spur to connect the Port of Savannah's Gate 3 to SR 25, SR 21 and US 80. Expected completion is in mid-2026. The \$1.4 billion Savannah Harbor Expansion Project (SHEP) is underway to deepen its navigation channel from 42 feet to 47 feet, enabling larger and heavier vessels to call on the port with

projected completion in 2021

- The Port's Ocean Terminal is transforming to a container only facility in two phases. Initial work will provide 2,800 linear feet of berth space, capable of serving two big ships simultaneously. The project will also bring expanded gates and paving allowing for 2.0 million twenty-foot equivalent container units. Phase I will be complete by mid-2027 and Phase II by mid-2028, increasing capacity by up to 1.5 million TEUs per year.
- Rail connectivity to every major destination east of the Mississippi via two Class I railroads, Norfolk Southern and CSX Transportation
- The GPA is investing \$29 million in an overpass at Ocean Terminal that will avoid truck traffic on local roads by connecting departing trucks directly to U.S. Route 17.
- 2023 Throughput: 4.9 million TEU's
- 2024 Throughput: 5.5 million TEU's
