








ROOTED IN REDLANDS HISTORY AND READY FOR THE FUTURE

THIS HISTORIC BUILDING, CONSTRUCTED IN 1889 BY W.N.
CHAMBLIN, SERVED AS A WAREHOUSE AND SALES FACILITY FOR
HAY AND GRAIN, LEAVING AN INDELIBLE MARK ON HISTORIC
DOWNTOWN REDLANDS. PROUDLY STANDING AS ONE OF THE
CITY'S OLDEST STRUCTURES, IT IS A CHERISHED REMNANT OF
REDLANDS' BYGONE ERA. FROM 1899 TO 1923, IT WAS HOME
TO GRAHAM-COPE COMMERCIAL COMPANY, HELMED BY LOCAL
BUSINESSPERSON AND PHILANTHROPIST EDWARD M. COPE.
WITHIN ITS WALLS, THE COMPANY OPERATED A BUSTLING GRAIN
WAREHOUSE AND BARLEY MILL. IN 1943, COPE HANDED OVER
THE REINS TO OTTO AND SUE KNUDSEN, ESTEEMED FIGURES IN
TRUCKING, MOVING, STORAGE, AND THE YUCAIPA VALLEY FRUIT
COMPANY. THE BUILDING THEN CHANGED HANDS AGAIN IN 1958,
FINDING ITS NEW OWNERS IN JOHN AND ALMA GRIGSBY. IN 1986,

THE GRIGSBYS PASSED ON THEIR BUSINESS TO VICTORIA AND MICHAEL HARGRAVE, WHO TRANSFORMED IT INTO THE BELOVED GRIGSBY GARDEN CENTER. IN 1988, THE HARGRAVES BECAME THE PROPERTY'S PROUD OWNERS. THE NURSERY THRIVED UNTIL 1997 WHEN THEY EMBARKED ON A NEW VENTURE, TRANSFORMING THE SPACE INTO A VIBRANT SKATE PARK THAT OPERATED UNTIL 2003. THROUGHOUT THE PAST 19 YEARS, STATISTICAL RESEARCH DILIGENTLY CARRIED OUT EXTENSIVE RENOVATIONS, PAYING HOMAGE TO THE PROPERTY'S EXTRAORDINARY HISTORY WHILE REVITALIZING ITS BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS. THE CURRENT OWNERSHIP IS LOOKING TO ENHANCE THE PROPERTY WHILE BEING MINDFUL TO THE HISTORIC NATURE OF THE ASSET. THIS IS A ONCE IN A GENERATION OPPORTUNITY FOR POTENTIAL USERS TO ENJOY THE ADAPTIVE REUSE OF THIS HISTORIC PROPERTY.


