



The walkable streets of downtown Lancaster also provide convenient proximity to popular local restaurants, boutique shops, and vital local infrastructure, including the Lancaster County Administration Building and the Lancaster County Courthouse. These underutilized properties are well-known fixtures of the downtown area, seen by more than 10,000 vehicles passing on the surrounding streets each day.


Major Industries by Employee Count







2025 Own vs. Rent - 1 Mile Radius





