


Zoning - City of Meridian C-G (Commercial)



BOISE MARKET OVERVIEW

WHO ARE WE?

The Boise Valley is strategically located in the Mountain Time Zone and Southwestern Idaho, providing easy non-stop access to all major cities on the West Coast, the Pacific Northwest and Intermountain West.

The Southwest Region is home to 942,676 people (Community Planning Association of Southwest Idaho) and a workforce of 388,815 within a 45-minute draw of Boise. The average commute time is 22 minutes.

Commuting in the Valley: The major interstate serving the Boise Valley is I-84, running through the metro area's major cities Boise, Meridian, Nampa and Caldwell, and I-184 branches toward the northeast into downtown Boise. Daily commutes are easy for the Boise Valley's population with federal highways 20, 26, and 30 and state highways 21, 44 and 55 providing access. ValleyRide offers public transportation throughout the Boise Valley.




Cost of Living- Cost of living in Idaho is 7.8 percent lower than the national average



WHAT ABOUT LOGISTICS?




There are 50 motor freight companies traveling 5 interstates, 20 U.S. highways and 30 state highways that serve the Boise Valley. More than 1,600 miles of rail line through Union Pacific and Burlington Northern Santa Fe provide connection points to Canada, Mexico and the U.S. They are aided by the State's regional line and 6 short line railroads. Annually, the rail system transports over 11 million tons of freight.

AIR SERVICE

The Boise Airport (BOI) is served by eight airlines that offer nonstop flights to 26 destinations and handles more than three million travelers each year.





IDAHO INCENTIVES

IDAHO BUSINESS ADVANTAGE

Businesses that invest at least \$500,000 in new facilities and create at least 10 new jobs paying \$40,000 annually plus benefits, with additional jobs paying an average of \$15.50 per hour during project period, may qualify for:

An enhanced investment tax credit on tangible personal property of 3.75%.

A new jobs tax credit from \$1,500-\$3,000 for new jobs paying \$24.04 per hour or more.

A 2.5% investment tax credit on real property.

A 25% rebate on sales tax paid during the project period.

Upon request of the business, the local county commissioners may also authorize a partial or full property tax exemption for up to 5 years.

IDAHO TAX INCENTIVES

Tax Reimbursement Incentive (TRI)

Companies creating new, high-wage jobs in Idaho can receive up to a 30% reimbursement on sales, payroll and corporate income taxes for up to 15 years. Companies must pay wages above the county average and create at least 50 new jobs in an urban area or 20 new jobs in a rural area.

3% Investment Tax Incentive

Credit against Idaho Corporate Income tax for qualifying new investment in tangible personal property (machinery & equipment) in Idaho. It can offset up to 50% of a company's liability and may be carried forward 14 years.

Data Center Tax Exemption

New data centers choosing to locate in Idaho will be eligible for sales tax exemption on server equipment as well as construction materials used in the construction of the data center facility.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT TRAINING FUND (WDTF)

The Idaho Workforce Development Council awards grants to reimburse approved training costs to eligible applicants bringing jobs to Idaho, adding jobs through expansion and/or retraining existing workers.

IDAHO OPPORTUNITY FUND

A grant program which allows the Director of Idaho Department of Commerce to direct funds to projects for infrastructure needs within the community. This is a "deal closing fund" to strengthen Idaho's competitive ability to support expansion of existing Idaho businesses and recruit new companies to the state, ultimately creating new jobs and economic growth in Idaho. Funds can be used for public infrastructure improvements to a new or existing facility.

IDAHO COLLEGE SAVINGS TAX CREDIT

Employers are eligible to receive a 20% tax credit for contributions made to an employee's Ideal college savings account. The tax credit is capped at \$500 per employee, per taxable year.
