
The Rosetta Room

- **Major active sites** like *Site 17* prepped for future mixed-use and transit-focused districts.
- **Strong institutional anchors** including *ASU's Media and Immersive eXperience (MIX) | Benedictine University | Mesa Community College Downtown Center.*
- **Robust city-led support** through incentives, planning, and urban transformation services.
- **Pedestrian-friendly implementation:** streetscape enhancements, light rail, parking, and micromobility support.
